

The Ruins in the Woods

The exciting discovery of a local medieval site at Hartygrove Brake, Lower Hazel, is the subject of this illustrated talk by Aaron Gridlestone. Aaron leads the Community Archaeological Excavation Group, which looks at the history and archaeology of the ongoing excavation of about 15 years by Thornbury and District Museum Archaeological Research Group. Students and tutors from Bristol University join in each summer, sometimes accompanied by interested parties from abroad.




The investigation ranges from a 1940s den, the search for a chapel and into life during the time of England's First Civil War. This fascinating discovery of a medieval hunting lodge so close to home, brings history to life, linking us with our roots. Aust Parish Council

Council update

The Parish Council has been involved in several planning applications recently, including one which Littleton residents will be aware of, for redevelopment of part of the Whale Wharf estate as an addiction treatment centre. At the time of writing, the outcome of this application is uncertain but by the time you read this, the decision should be available on the South Glos. Council website: *developments.southglos.gov.uk/online-applications/* then search for the reference P23/02219/F.

In January, councillors set our budget for the next financial year, and the resulting 'precept' tax funding amount, which is collected on our behalf by South Glos. Council as part of your regular council tax bill. The annual charge for an average Band D household will be £28.54, a rise of 6.2% or just under £1 from last year.

We are also involved in ongoing discussions with South Glos. Council about possibly forming a volunteer group to help care for the Woodwell Meadows nature reserve. Thank you to those residents who have been in touch to offer help – we are finding that it is a longer process than we had initially appreciated but we will get back to you when progress has been made!

You can keep up to date with the parish council's activities via our minutes which are published on the website: bit.ly/austpc_docs.

Annual Parish Assembly

The Parish Assembly is a chance for residents to hear about what the Parish Council has been doing on their behalf over the past year, listen to speakers on matters of local interest, and raise any points which they would like the council to consider in the near future. This year's Assembly will be held on **Tuesday 9th April at 7:00pm** in Elberton Village Hall. Steve Meredith, who has been Chairman of the council for the past year, will give our annual report and the local SGC ward councillors will also attend. Other speakers have not yet been confirmed but it is hoped that we will hear from:

- the police neighbourhood team,
- our local Village Agent about her role in supporting more vulnerable members of our community,
- Sustainable Thornbury, who are planning to set up a community energy scheme in the area.

Look out for more information on the council website and noticeboards from the end of March.

Sandy Lane Tunnels, Aust





Aust residents will have seen that work has finally started to repair the roadway underneath the M48, between Sandy Lane and Manor Farm. National Highways report that a new water main had to be constructed after problems were discovered; this was completed in mid-February but unfortunately has meant a delay in the planned timescales. Other utilities have also had to be diverted. Work has now started to remove the old surfacing (see photos) but again has been more complicated than anticipated, with asbestos found in some of the old materials requiring careful handling. The latest estimate of timescales is for the tunnels to be reopened towards the end of May, though National Highways and their contractors are trying to find ways to speed this up if possible.



Brigadoon

This year's audience was whisked from the cosy confines of Olveston Parish Hall to the Highlands of Scotland through a most atmospheric Brigadoon mist, cleverly created by gauze and subtle lighting from Richard Churchill. Scenery has to work hard - quickly and inventively - in this little hall, and in the experienced hands of Andy Black and his team, and the very efficient stage crew, it always does. Like the two American tourists of the story, the audience soon found themselves immersed in the mystical glens, forests and village of Brigadoon itself.



The show was yet another wise choice by Linda Evans for her cast, and the chance to resurrect an often forgotten musical. Maybe its fairy-tale innocence doesn't have immediate appeal for more cynical, modern audiences, and perhaps there are fewer well-known numbers to be heard. However, the company, as ever, gave all its enthusiasm, talent and commitment to bring a little gem alive.

The music was expertly handled by Chloe Allsopp-Jones and her quartet. Balance, pace and panache are always their hallmark, which brings real quality to the performances. One addition this year was a piper for the funeral lament which, together with Isobel Lambie's graceful dance, made a very moving scene. The singing of both the male and female choruses was strong, clear and expressive; indeed, all the full cast scenes benefited from a very evident team spirit and vivacity, as numbers like Jeannie's Packing Up and The Chase showed.

Cameron's father, Dan, played Tommy Albright, one of the American tourists who enter the mysterious world of Brigadoon. His performance had confidence, charm and sincerity which paired so well with his heroine, Fiona MacKeith, played by Emily Jones. Is she Scottish? Her accent was perfect, even in her singing, which was as glorious. Her purity of pitching gave the real period feel, which is so often lacking in the modern musical 'sliding' onto notes. Emily gave Fiona all the innocence and good-humoured grace the part demanded, a most winning and professional performance.



The comic roles of American Jeff Douglas (Paul Harrod) and Brigadoon flirt Meg Brockie (Kate Coyle) gave much amusement with their timing and liveliness. (See photo on the left) Kate's patter-type songs were truly challenging, but carried off with real skill, sparkle and clarity. Paul's gently sozzled jokes and scepticism were delivered with a delightful American accent and flavour. Paul Dimery's splendid traditional delivery of Charlie Cameron's songs and warm character provided an excellent contrast, and Phil Savage, as Mr Murdoch, delivered a most difficult and long speech about Brigadoon's mystery very convincingly and logically.

All the leading roles were very well supported by those who played cameos


Collectors' Book Fair



Update on the 918 Bus

The 918 bus runs through our villages on the route of the former 622. Unlike the 622, it only runs twice per day - once in time to get pupils to The Castle School in Thornbury in the morning and then to bring them home at the end of the school day. It exists as a result of a long-running campaign by parents, so that children in our area can get to school.

The bus is open to all members of the public and stops at Rock Street in Thornbury as well as The Castle School. The fare from Olveston Parish to Thornbury is £3 return and £2 single (regardless of age). In the morning, the 918 leaves Tockington (The Swan) at 08.04, Olveston (Haw Lane) at 08.08 and Old Down at 08.10. It returns from The Castle School at 15.30 and Rock Street at 15.35.

The bus is supported by a subsidy from South Gloucestershire Council. The good news is that the Council have just agreed to continue the subsidy until July 2025 (it was previously July 2024). They have so far provided three emergency subsidies to keep the bus going, while we continue to discuss long term funding with the West of England Combined Authority (the organisation with responsibility for public buses in our region).

Please spread the word about the bus to people who may not know about it. If you or your child relies on this bus for transport, please let me know (cbrewser@freeuk.com). You won't be asked to do anything else, but if we know how many people rely on the bus, it will help our discussions about its future. Thank you.



An April Tweet

Dr Rovert

As many of us know, our garden bird population has been declining for some time. Research has shown that that this decline is caused primarily by a



reduction in natural habitat brought about by the need for greater efficiency in agriculture. So we are indeed grateful that South Glos. Council, through its Parish Councils, is promoting a Biodiversity Action Plan, one aspect of which is to restore the wild life habitat in our area by encouraging garden owners to cultivate plants which are 'wild life friendly.'


But I have to report that this will not solve the problem – not in the West Country anyway. Recent research has shown that there is a much more sinister reason for the decline. Several years ago (as you may remember) a 'wonder bird food' was introduced into our market: Japanese Walnuts. Everyone loved them, including the birds: they sang louder, their plumage was brighter and they seemed friendlier. But, shortly after this, the decline in bird numbers accelerated and some disappeared almost entirely. The research suggested that the Japanese Walnuts were the cause because they were probably programming the birds to fly east. The Japanese Walnut tree (Juglans ailantifolia) is native to Japan and is unhappy growing anywhere else, so it was possible the nuts were sending some kind of message to the bird saying "I don't like it here – take me home."

The researchers then travelled to East Anglia to test their theory, and sure enough they discovered that, far from decreasing, the number of small garden birds in that region had been *increasing* over the last few years! Several residents commented on this and one reported that the blue tits always seemed to prefer nest boxes that looked out over the sea to the east.

The researchers then decided to see if they could solve the problem. They set out feed trays containing Oregon Filberts, these are the fruit of the Oregon hazel, a tree native only to the US state of Oregon. Would the birds eat them? Would it programme them to fly west? Would they return to South Glos?

So far it's been partly successful: YES, the birds are eating them. YES they are flying west. YES they are coming to South Glos. But they are not the species that left us. The birds coming in are mainly avocets and bitterns! So here's the challenge for us: What do we do to make them feel at home? Providing the right habitat is the top priority and so, if you'd like to help, come along to Olveston Stores at 10.00 a.m. on April 1st to collect a free supply of wet reed plants for your garden. Let's show we welcome our immigrants from the east!



Do you know......disposable vapes are becoming one of the defining images of our throwaway society? Disposable vapes are almost impossible to recycle and they create huge amounts of waste. For

every vape sold, there's the production of plastic, mining for lithium, shipping for transport and packaging to sell it. Then the waste at the end of its life. In the UK we bin nearly 5 million vapes each week. The safest way to recycle any vape is with other small electrical appliances for the kerbside collection or find the nearest vape collection point.

The use of a lithium battery in a single-use product doesn't make sense. Over 10 tonnes of lithium were thrown out with disposable vapes in UK in one year. That's enough to make batteries for 1,200 electric cars. For a green transition we need to get the most use out of scarce minerals like lithium. Vapes also contain chemicals and nicotine which are hazardous waste that will leak into the environment when disposed.

Spring is with us..... so think about garden birds and put out some feeders as they rear their young. Bluebells and primroses will be out in the woods for you to see on a country ramble.
