



Farmer's Bishop

At our meeting to discuss this December edition of the magazine, somebody suggested a 'Festive Recipe' might be a good idea. Mincemeat and Christmas Pudding recipes were rejected as both of these should have been made last month...... however, a mulled drink to share with friends and family was considered a good idea. At this point, our Treasurer remembered a drink called Farmer's Bishop which was around during his 1950s American childhood. When he got home, he even found the recipe, which he'd written on the back of an envelope well over thirty years ago.



Now, bearing in mind that in America, apple cider is actually a non-alcoholic, unfiltered apple juice, this recipe for 50 drinks would still have packed a punch with its three bottles of apple brandy (known also as applejack) at around 92° proof.

The recipe, below, dates from 1951 and gives quantities for 24 people. As it is also of American origin, I'm guessing the cider referred to is the non-alcoholic version and Somerset Cider Brandy, or Calvados from France, could substitute for the Apple Brandy.

- 6 oranges
- around 4 dozen whole cloves



- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1/2 gallon cider
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg

Stick each orange with 8 cloves and bake them whole in a slow oven for one hour. Place them in a heated punch bowl and prick them well with a fork. Heat the apple brandy in a saucepan until warm, be careful especially if you're using a gas stove - and pour over the oranges then sprinkle with the sugar. While warming the brandy, heat the cider to almost boiling. Take 1/2 cup of the cider and mix the remaining



spices in it, then set it aside. Carefully light the brandy using a sugar cube soaked with a bit of the brandy, place it in the bowl of a long-handled spoon, light it and then stand back while placing the burning cube in the boozy punch. Let it burn for a few seconds, then add the hot cider to extinguish the flames: stir in the cup of spiced cider.

Where next for OPTA?

Like most other local organisations, OPTA has had an enforced break from regular activities due to the pandemic: a planned trip to France in spring 2020 was cancelled and there have been no fundraising events of any kind for nearly two years.

This pause has given the committee a chance to think about how to take OPTA forward into 2022 and beyond. We have been twinned with Bréhan, which is a village in Brittany, for over twenty years and there is no way that we want to change that. However, we need to consider whether we should carry on with our programme of annual visits to and from France or change the way in which we function.

- Should we make use of IT and keep our links with Bréhan alive by sending annual or bi-annual newsletters rather than visits?
- Could we facilitate links between the primary schools in Olveston and Bréhan?
- Is there a role for us to encourage, and where necessary support. homestays for young people from either village who wish to improve their French or English?
- Our fundraising events over the years have been quite popular, with the Annual Wine Challenge being guite a 'money-spinner'. Should we extend our twinning remit? For instance, we might 'twin' with a village in the developing world and use the money we raise to help with projects in this new location?

OPTA members will be contacted to gather their views on new ideas or developments, and we will be holding an AGM in early 2022, probably February.

Free Flu Jabs for Carers

If you are the main carer for an elderly or disabled person who may be put at risk if you fall ill, you should be offered a free flu iab.

GP practices have advised that they are offering flu jabs in the usual way, despite Covid-19. However, this year everyone over 50 will be offered a free flu jab and other categories of people also eligible for a free flu jab include carers, those who are pregnant and those with certain health conditions. Call your GP surgery to get your free flu jab.

Parish Players present Calamity Jane!







Photographers and Young Chef, again with local winners progressing to the following rounds. Up to twelve local Primary Schools have regularly taken part in Thornbury Rotary's annual Youth Speaks Competition. The club also actively supports and has had a long association with the annual 'Thornbury in Bloom' competition.

Internationally, the club has secured Rotary Matching Grants for water projects in Kenya, Nepal and Burkina Faso. In 1981 Thornbury twinned with the Rotary Club of Barbezieux in France and bi-annual visits were enjoyed for many years. The club has always been active on the End Polio Now campaign, even purchasing an Iron Lung for display, to raise awareness and funds at events.

Since the first Thornbury Rotary Swimarathon in 1986 (the main fundraiser) the club has raised around half a million pounds to date. This has allowed the club to donate between £12,000 and £17,000 each year to various charities such as Alzheimer's Society, Carers Support Centre and Jigsaw, together with many other national and local charities over the years. When Swimarathon 2021 had to be cancelled, the club created an alternative socially distanced fundraising event within the Thornbury Community, known as Thornbury Walkathon. This event raised over £10,000 to support charities and good causes. Thornbury Rotary hopes to hold the event again in the future. Recently, the club stepped in to run the Annual Welsh Choir Concert, a highlight of the social calendar in Thornbury.


The club has made several changes to make it more attractive for new membership and retention. It is now less formal, meeting just twice a month in Thornbury. Members can join meetings either physically or via Zoom. Looking to the future, Thornbury Rotary is keen to attract younger members, whatever gender and background. To that end, a satellite club has been formed called Thornbury Rotary Network (TRN), with the hope of attracting a more diverse and younger group of community members, who are still working, rather than retired.

Rotary will continue to support the communities of Thornbury and surrounding villages for many years to come. The hope is that membership of Thornbury Rotary Network will become more and more established over time and very active in the community. 

Things happen to people - moments in time that have the most profound of consequences for ever. Those moments may be the briefest of time, or they may last years, leaving us changed forever. One of the reasons life can never be the same again is that they force us to re-evaluate our priorities. It has been said that on their deathbed no one has ever been heard saying: "I wish I'd spent more time at the office". What has been heard, time and again, are the words: "I wish I'd spent more time with my family".

Some people manage to recognise the true priorities before it is too late. Those who were living in the time of Noah in the Bible were so caught up in their daily activities that they were neglectful of the inevitable consequences of the lifestyle they followed and were overwhelmed by those consequences. Had their priorities been different, they would have seen the warning signs long before and would have changed their ways before it was too late.

As each Advent comes around, marking the beginning of a new church year, we are challenged to look again at what is important to us and, in reevaluating, to re-direct our energies and our focus on things of true importance. If we live our lives with a sense of purpose, and a wholehearted dedication to God's Kingdom, then we will be undaunted and unshaken should the unexpected catch us unawares.

Saint Paul, in his letter to the Romans, gives us the wake-up call we need as we begin this season of Advent. Now is the time, he urges us, to wake up from our lethargy and laziness - to get up out of the ruts we get in to. Now is the time to be alert. If we do not continually change and re-direct our focus, then when tragedy does strike, the effect is all the more painful and devastating.

This time of preparation for the coming of the Christ-child at Christmas is a wonderful opportunity for us to rediscover what our lives are really all about. In our workplaces, in our homes, in our communities, let us reflect and again ask ourselves: what are the things dearest to our hearts? And let us this Advent, re-focus our lives and initiate the necessary action in the light of what we discern.
