

### December's Movie

### The Robin



As Christmas approaches many of us will begin to receive greetings cards, and some will include a picture of a robin. Why is this? The reason goes back to Victorian times. Postmen wore red uniforms and were nicknamed 'The Robins'. Initially it was



greetings cards, but over time they were replaced by a picture of the bird itself delivering the card.

In addition, the robin features a lot in winter folklore and is a symbol of hope. This being due to its visibility during the winter months, with a cheerful song and of course providing - with its red breast - some colour on cold and bleak days. Within Christian legends one story says that the robin fluffed its feathers to protect baby Jesus's fire and got scorched in the process. Resulting in its red breast. There are several variations of this tale.

In the UK and some other northern European countries such as Finland and Germany where households feed garden birds, there is an association between humans and the robin. We often see one close by as we dig in the garden, because we expose food for it as we go about our business. In the wild, robins will follow animals such as pig or wild boar, this is because they chum up the ground when hunting for food - doing the same thing as ourselves when we garden. So, whilst we may like to think it is trying to be our best friend in the garden, it is just following its learnt behaviour in the wild. That being said, I have had many conversations with robins on the allotment whilst I am digging up food for them! Perhaps the lovely song they sing is just telling me to get on with it.

The robin is a remarkable bird and probably to many people our most recognisable. It belongs to the Old-World flycatcher family Muscicapidae. Whilst it is associated with winter, it can suffer in cold spells if it cannot access shelter and food and many will die. In their first year robins suffer very high mortality rates with over two thirds not surviving due to cold weather and high predation, especially from household cats and other birds such as sparrowhawks. The average life expectancy is low due to this, less than two years. However, if one survives its first year then things really look up, with a

small number reaching around six years and one was even recorded at 18 years (an exception).

Both the male and female have red breasts, which for the male grows larger and brighter as it gets older, in part determined by the amount of food it has found to eat therefore staying in good condition. This makes its chances of mating successfully grow greater, as the female will consider this male successful as it has not been predated and has been able to access food and shelter. The male and female are both very territorial and the red breast is also used as a visible sign of strength. In winter many of you will have seen robins protecting their territory in the garden. They do not like to share.

In the UK it is a resident bird with most staying within the UK. Some may migrate from the north further southwest. Those breeding in northern and eastern Europe, where winters are harsher, are migratory and many migrate to the UK. This is when we may see the numbers increase in our gardens as the migrant birds search for food sources to survive winter. One January a couple of years ago we were sailing across the North Sea to Norway. Whilst looking over the side of the ship I could see a small bird flying against the wind



towards us, it was really working hard to reach us, and it landed on the bow. It was a single robin right in the middle of the North Sea, on a very grey and windy day. I felt so relieved that it made it to the ship and was expecting it to stay. But of course, we were heading north, and it was going west probably originating from Germany or Finland. It had a quick breather

and off it flew. I hope it made it.

It is very easy to think when you are out and about, or looking at the birds in your garden, 'it's just a robin', but they really are fascinating birds and for such a small bird there is so much to say.



## A Christmas Message from the Allotments

Christmas is conventionally the time when we look at our Christmas cards, with images of ice and snow, skating on frozen ponds, Father Christmas in his sleigh drawn across the sky by reindeer and 'Good King Wenceslas' looking out on the 'Feast of Stephen'. But the lucky allotmenteers, members of Olveston's OPAGA gang, what else are they looking forward to this coming December 25th? Answer: this is the date on which I will discover whether my September bet will pay off, and I can harvest fresh potatoes straight out of the ground in December.

Yes, a long time ago I had stumbled across mentions of 'Christmas Potatoes', and not being a 'horny handed son of the soil', had dismissed the thought into nursery rhyme territory. Harvest fresh potatoes in the depths of winter. Nah, pull the other one. However, my pal Roger the Paint corrected me, advising that if you get your 'beans in a row' at the right time, 'wiv a little bit of luck' (Stanley Holloway), you can indeed have fresh potatoes with your Christmas Day lunch. A nice novelty, or what?

Now, I like spuds, especially if they are a variety with a taste I enjoy. So, the number one task in August or early September is to locate half a dozen suitable samples of that variety, and two or three plastic buckets. You can get the spuds from the supermarket for very little money; there is no need to go to a seed merchant or specialist supplier. Then at the end of August or beginning of September, instead of eating them, place in a dry location where the little



'eyes' at one end of the spud are exposed to some gentle daylight. After a week or two, these little 'eyes' will start to sprout.

Now you need your buckets – because who wants to traipse down to the Elberton Road allotment gate on Christmas Morning? Drill the base of your plastic buckets with three or four quarter inch holes and then put a

couple of spades of earth into the bucket. If you haven't got earth handy, soil from a tomato grow bag will do handsomely. Then place your three candidate spuds on the soil with the sprouting ('chits') growing from the eyes on top. Then lightly cover the three spuds with soil. Within a week or three, green leaves will appear above the sprouting spuds, and it is time to 'earth up', nearly covering the foliage with more soil. This stops the growing spuds from being exposed to daylight, which would turn them green, indicating a poisonous condition and ruins the flavour.

Place your spud grow bucket(s) outside in a sheltered daylight location where frost cannot get them, because that will ruin the fun come harvest time. Give the contents of your buckets an occasional splash of water to keep them fingertip moist and enjoy the anticipation of the feast to come. Spuds R Us!





### Tockington's Hidden History

Tockington is blessed with lots of history, but sadly, many interesting features are now lost, or at best, hidden from view.

How many people remember the infant school at the top of Old Down Hill, by the Scout Hut? Mrs Ashby was the last teacher there. In the 1800s pupils used to walk from as far afield as Ridgeway (now Rudgeway) to be educated in Victorian times and well into the 20th century.

In Washingpool Hill Road, opposite the driveway up to Sheepcombe House, is a sheep wash which was last used in 1944. It was probably constructed in the early 1800s and used by farmers to counter sheep scab.

Further up the valley, heading towards Lower Hazel, is a three-sided cart wash, now largely overgrown. Carts with wooden wheels and metal rims were driven in to the water (which was much higher and more reliably present than today) to allow the wood to expand back up against the rim.

If you then walk at 90 degrees up into the ancient woodland called Sheepcombe Brake, you might be able to find the old foundations of a stone cottage which was pulled down in 1947. The Stanley family lived there with no utilities whatsoever - no water, no electricity and definitely no gas or mains drainage. The family relocated to Mill Lane.

On the Lower Tockington Road, alongside Ivywell, is an ancient well currently known as Rams Well but originally it was called the Roman Well. Why? We don't know, but certainly there were Roman families living in the general area 1,800 years ago. Today it is totally overgrown.

Between Brook Farm, Little Brobury Farm and Lower Farm there used to be a ford. There are two verbal accounts collected in 1971 of local people recalling seeing boats tied up on the ford. This would probably have been as late as the end of the 1800s, but to date, no documentary evidence to back up these memories has been found.

Tockington Mill Rhine starts at this point on Lower Tockington Road. It is initially fed by water from an aquifer in Sheepcombe Brake and then from drains in the hills either side of the valley. The Rhine meanders all the way to Chestle Pill on the River Severn. Another article devoted entirely to the Rhine is planned for a future edition.

Tockington Green is of great importance but also of great mystery. Village fairs and markets were held on The Green from before the 12th century and as late as 1896. The Landlord of The Swan Inn, Mr Wilkins, recalled seeing a tethered bear on one occasion. And what about the stone circle, more properly called Tockington Cross? Did it have religious significance, perhaps connected to a lost chapel, or was it a 'butter market' display area? Where did the stones come from? Many are not of local origin so the circle must have had some serious significance.

Moving on, to Upper Tockington Road on the bend at the top of the hill (western side) are the remains of another well. Originally called the Eye Well, its waters were said to be a cure for many eye conditions. Then in the first years of the 20th century it was used to supply water for the massive steam powered traction machines used for road building and mending. By this time it was known as St Michael's Well.

It may be possible, with the agreement and support of local councils and landowners, to carry out conservation or restoration of these local historical sites. If you share our interest, do please contact us.

### Green Force



Ponds are familiar features of many field corners, village greens and gardens. They are generally small in size, not connected to each other or to streams and rivers and fed only by rainwater or groundwater. Village ponds were often created for washing down working horses.

One of the best ways of bringing more wildlife into an area, ponds can be very diverse, supporting many more aquatic plants and invertebrates than rivers and lakes. The best ponds for wildlife have shallow margins with a fringe of vegetation as cover for amphibians and insects. Half a million ponds have been lost over the last 100 years and one in five remaining ponds are in poor condition. Initiatives are underway to restore lost ponds. They need care as they become silted up with soil and debris. If you are by a pond on spring watch out for frog spawn and in summer for dragon flies hovering amongst much wildlife.

May the New Year be full of interest in nature - and all it has to offer us.



#### National Highways plans to re-open M48 Severn Bridge to HGVs

We know that many residents are concerned about the plans by National Highways to re-open the M48 Severn Bridge to heavy good vehicles. National Highways plan to introduce a filtering system to limit the number of HGVs on the bridge at one time; this will involve all HGVs approaching along the motorway being required to leave the M48 at Aust roundabout. Traffic from the roundabout (including vehicles from the A403, Elberton and the services) back onto the bridge approach will be controlled by traffic lights, with all vehicles being held back if there are already more than the safe number of HGVs on the bridge.

Parish councillors met with National Highways representatives recently to express concerns about these plans. Aust residents are already familiar with gridlock on the roundabout if queuing traffic blocks the 'yellow box' marked areas. Queueing traffic also brings higher levels of air pollution and noise.

The National Highways team acknowledged residents' concerns and assured us that they were using predictive methods including mathematical modelling to try and reduce the impacts as much as possible and that changes would be made if their modelling raised issues. However, recent press releases suggest that their plans are more firmly in place than we were led to believe.

The parish council will continue to liaise with National Highways and South Glos. Council to make sure residents' voices are heard and to try to minimise the impacts for local residents as much as possible.



### The Impossible Bomb

Olveston Parish Historical Society

We're glad to welcome back Gareth Williams, local resident and retired Dean of the Medical Faculty at the University of Bristol, to tell us about his latest book, rated 5 stars by the Daily Telegraph who describe it as 'superb'.

Having previously told us about the fights to combat polio and smallpox, he's recently been researching a different kind of battle, the race to build an atomic bomb.

His story starts in the 1930s, when the destructive potential of splitting the atom is dawning on international scientists. For those opposed to Nazi Germany, the possibility that Hitler had scientists working on an atomic bomb was a huge concern.

A recent film implied that the Americans under Oppenheimer at Los Alamos were uniquely responsible for creating the first atomic bomb.

Gareth's book offers a corrective, pointing out the significant part played by British scientists and Jewish refugee scientists in the top-secret British atomic programme, codenamed Tube Allovs.

For those growing up in the post-war years in Britain, as Gareth did, the threat of nuclear warfare was a looming presence, and he admits fearing the sight of a mushroom cloud boiling up into the sky above the rooftops. More recently, he was spurred into writing the book after coming across some de-classified government papers concerning a secret Maud Committee. He concluded the part played by non-Americans in developing atomic bomb science had been seriously under-reported.

To redress this, he tells a nuanced story, carefully researched and full of incident and endeavour. For our December meeting, he'll explain the science behind the project in a way that non-scientists can understand and he'll bring to life the human stories and the political difficulties involved. He is always a lively and engaging speaker, and we look forward to welcoming him back.
