### Rubber Town: Bradford on Avon



Many of you will know the lovely town of Bradford-on-Avon as a cloth-making town, with, later, some of those woollen mills housing the Avon Rubber company and the Moulton Bicycle Company.

Dan Farrell is technical director at Moulton Bicycles. On 4<sup>th</sup> January, he will tell us why



and how Bradford on Avon became 'Rubber Town', thanks to the determination of a man called Stephen Moulton, who, in 1842, brought samples of Charles Goodyear's 'vulcanised' rubber to England. Stephen purchased a derelict mill in Bradford-on-Avon and the grand, but decaying, Jacobean house that overlooked it and founded his own rubber manufacturing enterprise, overcoming many hurdles to do so.



The painting shown on the cover of Dan's book, see left, (which he'll bring along in case anyone would like a copy for £10) shows Stephen Moulton and his wife Elizabeth looking over The Hall and the rubber works from the Tump on the edge of town. In the foreground are their daughters, Kate and Elizabeth.

Stephen Moulton's factory in Bradford on Avon became the world's centre of production for 'railway rubber' including all manner of springs, hoses, glands, seals and gaskets. Its customers included Isambard Kingdom Brunel and Sir Nigel Gresley (designer of *The Flying Scotsman* and *Mallard* locomotives).

The factory employed almost all of the working-age population of Bradford on Avon for nearly 150 years. Come and hear all about it!

I volunteer at Southmead Hospital in the new Brunel Building, which opened in 2014 amalgamating the old Frenchay and Southmead Hospitals. It is a state-of-the-art hospital, with a vast atrium providing a light, bright public space. It doesn't look like a typical hospital and uses an airport type system of 'gates' to identify the different departments. The atrium houses two Costa coffee shops, a shop, a pharmacy and a League of Friends Café. It's a lively area with art exhibitions and quite often someone playing the piano. It aims to make visiting the hospital a welcoming and less stressful experience.



It takes 15 minutes to walk from one end of the building to the other, so a motorised buggy is available (driven by a volunteer) to assist those with mobility issues. There is an army of 'Move Makers' in the atrium, these are volunteers who help patients and visitors navigate their way through the online check in process and provide directions as required.

I started at Southmead in March 2022 as a Ward Support Volunteer. I report to the housekeeper on my allocated ward and my duties are basic, but vital. I work a 4-hour shift once a week starting at 9.30 am. My first job is to prepare the tea/coffee cart for the first round of the day, following breakfast. Once the cart is ready with freshly made tea, milk and biscuits I visit the individual rooms offering hot drinks and a chat if that's what the patient wants. There are two bays of 6 patients and the other 26 are in en-suite rooms. I check that the patients have fresh water and that the PPE stations are fully stocked - we get through a vast amount of gloves and aprons every day.



### Aust Parish Council

Happy New Year to all residents from Aust Parish Council! We are ready to kick off another year of serving the communities of Aust, Elberton and Littleton.

### Council budget 2023-24

The first big task of the new year is to set the council budget for the coming financial year. Councillors have carefully considered each element of spending and will try to set a budget which balances keeping the council running smoothly against the rising costs which we know residents are facing. It is likely that there will be a small increase in the parish precept (the share of your council tax which comes to the parish council) compared to last year, but the precept will still be less than £30 per year for most households. The exact amount will be set at the next council meeting on 10<sup>th</sup> January.

#### Could you serve your community as a parish councillor?

Later in the year, May 2023 will see elections to the parish council, alongside the South Glos Council elections. Anyone who thinks they might be interested in being part of the council is warmly encouraged to talk to one of the current councillors or contact the Clerk to ask any questions they might have and find out a bit more about what is involved. ### Winter Wonders

Paul Godwin

In January we are in wintertime, where summer now feels a very long time ago and we are looking forward to spring. For many, winter can seem like a season where the 'natural world' has closed down until spring. We therefore risk not going out so much to walk and explore. It is true of course the trees have shed their leaves, many of the birds which nest here in summer have left for warmer climates and some mammals will be in their winter hibernation. However, there is still an abundance of life. In old and ancient woodlands we can see many types of fungi. You can now see the shape and structure of the trees, observe overwintering birds and the woodland floor is a carpet of colour from the fallen leaves. So winter is a wonderful time to go out to explore.

Just over the Severn Bridge - and no more than 15 to 30 minutes away - we are very fortunate to have access to areas of ancient woodland and wildlife habitat. Due to the close proximity of these areas to where I live in Olveston, I go to a number of these areas fairly frequently in winter: The Piercefield woodland, the ancient heathland and woodland areas accessed from Tidenham Chase car park (including The Poor's Allotment Nature Reserve) and also the Nagshead RSPB Reserve and woodland near Parkend. Each of these locations offers something very different in each season of the year.

What follows are some photographs of fungi I have taken recently in these woodlands, and they are just a very small example of those which you may find. Firstly, here is the 'Chicken of the Woods' or Sulphur Polypore.



This is a bracket fungus and can be found on beech. oak, cherry, chestnut and vew trees. As you can see its colours are bright, so quite easy to identify. They can be found on both upright or fallen



trees, from summer through to early winter. Large specimens can make it through winter itself. This photograph was taken at the end of November 2022 in the Nagshead woodlands at Parkend. It has a positive benefit to wildlife, deer often feed on it and some beetles live and feed on it, including the hairy fungus beetle. It is known to be an edible fungus unless it is growing on yew (which is a toxic tree), but my advice would be unless you are very skilled and knowledgeable about fungi identification (which I am not) do not try eating it. Apparently it does not agree with everyone, and my view is that it looks far better on the tree!

The fly algaric is probably one of the most identifiable and photogenic fungi. It has featured in many fairy tale illustrations of mushrooms and fairy rings. I have never seen one in our immediate area so was very pleased to come across this specimen, which was photographed in November 2022,



on the edge of woodland near The Poor's Allotment Nature Reserve. This is a poisonous mushroom which also has a psychoactive and hallucinatory affect, so please do not be tempted. It is steeped in mythology including references within 'Alice's Adventures in Wonderland' when Alice is given the mushroom to eat. DO NOT try this at home! In Victorian times it was a common image on Christmas cards and its colours may have influenced Santa Claus's red and white coat. Reindeers can also be seen in a 'drunken state' after eating this mushroom and indeed it is possible that this is where the references come from of Santa's reindeers being able to fly.

The fly algaric also has a traditional use as an insecticide, where it is crumbled up in milk which then attracts houseflies who die as a result of the poisonous effect. Hence its name. The specimen in the photograph is likely to be almost fully grown, as when they first emerge through leaf litter they are entirely covered in white warts which they then begin to lose as they grow and the red pellicle shows through.




I am including the photograph, above, although I have not been able to identify it. I thought it was worthy of inclusion as it is a very striking specimen. It may belong to the genus Rhodotus or possibly Creidotus but I am really not sure? Given its striking features I really felt that I should be able to identify it. I did say that I am not an expert! So, if there are any mycologists reading who are able to identify this fungi, I would be pleased to hear from them via Meeting Point.

# Playing with Words - Mondegreens and Feghoots Marelin Orr-Ewing\*

#### Mondegreens

Firstly, what is a Mondegreen? It is a mishearing or misinterpretation of a phrase in a way that gives it a new, if slightly odd, meaning. The origin – allegedly – comes from a mishearing of the words in a Scottish ballad The Bonny Earl of Murray:

Ye Highlands and ye Lowlands, Oh, where hae ye been? They hae slain the Earl o' Moray, And laid him on the green.

The final line was misheard and thought to be 'And Lady Mondegreen'. Hence, Mondegreens.....

Back in the day, many children sang the hymn with the words *Gladly my cross-eyed bear*, or the carol, *While shepherds washed their socks by night*. In popular music there are many examples, such as the line in Purple Haze by Jimi Hendrix where people were convinced it was 'kiss this guy', when he actually sang 'scuse me while I kiss the sky'. In The Beatles' song Lucy in the Sky with Diamonds, a line was heard as the girl with colitis goes by (the girl with kaleidoscope eyes). And the mishearing of the line 'All of the other reindeers' in the song Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer inspired a children's book titled *Olive, The Other Reindeer*.

Outside of song lyrics or hymns, there is a story of a typist writing 'jockstrap position' instead of juxtaposition, or the invitation to a Haddock Stirring Committee (ad hoc steering committee)'. Or the very famous 'send three and four pence, we're going to a dance' (Send reinforcements, we're going to advance'). Jane Asher, the actress turned cake-maker, wrote that she had once received a letter addressed to Mr J Nasher and the letter began.......

Dear Mr Nasher.

### **Feghoots**

A feghoot is a humorous short story or anecdote where the punchline is a well-known phrase or saying which has been deliberately turned into a Mondegreen – where the words sound the same but have a different meaning. (Homophones, in fact!)

This naturally occurring plant can be manufactured into packaging to hold liquids, coating for food containers and paper for the cosmetic and fashion industry and is fully biodegradable. Seaweed farming simultaneously creates new opportunities for fishing communities. NOTPLA has won a considerable financial reward which hopefully will give them the means to invest in their new company to make it into a fully commercial enterprise. Well done NOTPLA.




I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life (John 8:12)

This verse inspired William Holman Hunt to paint 'The Light of the World'. You may be familiar with it, if not you can find out more on the internet. It reminds me of an old Victorian Christmas card. The painting shows Jesus holding a bright lantern about to knock on a door, one that is overgrown with greenery and with no handle. It is a night in autumn/wintertime. The picture is full of allegorical meaning, and it illustrates Revelation 3:20: Listen! Perhaps the painting can again capture the interest like it did in the Victorian period. Whatever the new year will bring, we do have the opportunity to walk in the light.
