



Roe and Fallow Deer

This article first appeared in our March online-only edition and is repeated here in case you missed it. The deer have been spotted again, as recently as late April.

On 25th January, a beautiful sunny day, whilst out walking locally, I was fortunate to photograph some wild roe and fallow deer, one of which was an infrequently seen 'white deer'.



The identification of this deer prompted me to do a little research in which the British Deer Society were very helpful. Both deer in the photograph above were identified as young fallow bucks (kid males), one of whose coat was white, the other black. There are four recognised colour types for fallow deer, common (tan/fawn), menil (which is a paler colouration with white spots year round) black and white. I was interested to find out if this deer would be classified as albino due to its white colouration and pink nose? No, was the answer to this question, due to its brown eyes. If it were albino it would have had red or pink eyes, and this would have made the sighting very rare. The classification for this deer is 'Leucitic White' which is representative of a wide variety of conditions resulting in the partial loss of pigmentation which causes white colouration of the coat and skin but not the eyes. Leucitic white deer are infrequently seen in comparison to other colour types. So, whilst not being a

'very rare' sighting it does come into the 'infrequent' category, which I was still very pleased about.

The two young fallow bucks were near to an adult fallow buck, showing its black winter coat and antlers. (See below) All three were grazing when I saw first saw them and I was very fortunate to take these pictures, as very soon after I took them, they ran for the cover of woodland.



Just a few minutes prior to taking these photographs I managed to photograph two roe deer. These had been grazing in an adjacent field on shrubs. These were identifiable by the distinguishable buff rump. The jumping deer being identified as a mature doe (female) and the other a young doe which was likely to have been born last May or June.



I count myself as very lucky to photograph these deer. It was a beautiful day in which there was plenty of wildlife to see and to photograph. This reminded me how lucky we are to have such wonderful countryside and wildlife around us, which we can walk into from our doorsteps.



So, if you see some deer out on your walks, a very basic guide to their identification is:

- fallow deer are larger than roe deer and they have a distinctive black inverted horseshoe shape on their rump, with a tail and a black stripe.
- A roe deer does not have a tail but does have a distinguishable buff patch on its rump. In winter, however, the doe roe does grow a tuft of hair on its buff rump which can appear like a small white tail. So, be warned.
- The antlers of a fallow deer are larger than a roe deer and are flat and broader (palmate).
- A fallow deer also has a more elongated face than a roe, which has larger ears and large black eyes.

An Unsolved Parish Mystery

Much has been written about navigation and methods of transport on the River Severn. Indeed, pottery shards have been found at Hill and the coast nearby, indicating river borne commerce was happening even in Roman times. Many people are also aware of the many (80 plus) barges or trows (pronounced as in "crows") beached on the Eastern bank of the Severn at Purton, placed there to curb erosion of the riverbank during the last century.

Very little, however, is factually recorded of how the rhynes in our parish were used for the transport of goods. The rhynes were created as a drainage system in medieval times and their waters finally end up in the Severn. It is thought that boats brought provisions, often coal, up the system of rhynes from the River into Olveston parish. These boats were flat bottomed, though sometimes with "D" shaped hulls, narrow and nothing like as long as the Severn trows. It is almost certain, but again there seems to be no written record, that these boats would have taken flour from Tockington Mill (at the bottom of Mill Lane) to the Severn and onwards. A two-way commerce system.

The navigable length of the rhynes is again uncertain. There are two Port Farms, one on Catherine Hill and another on Hardy Lane, but it is also likely that the Tockington rhyne would have extended past the mill and as far as Washingpool Hill. From there supplies could be taken to Tockington Manor and Sheepcombe Farm, in the 16th & 17th centuries this was one of the most important farms in the whole of Avon.

The trouble is, what little is known is really just handed-down folklore, no written history, only the spoken word and there are no abandoned barges lying on the edge of a rhyne as might be expected, which would verify the whole subject. There is one factual clue, according to local historian Mr Eric Garrett, who recalls a painting made around 1920, though it might have been someone's recollection of an earlier period. The artist was a Tockington lady, and it apparently depicted a trow on Tockington ford. The ford was at the bottom of Lower Tockington Road, by Little Brobury Farm but was subsequently diverted under the road. Eric says that the painting was lost, but could it just be hanging, unloved, on the wall of someone's lounge? Yours perhaps?

Jeremy Warren

Jeremy has recently been elected to Aust Parish Council and is definitely a local. He grew up in Almondsbury, his wife Janet comes from Littleton and they both went to Thornbury Grammar School and Marlwood. Then their lives diverged, although they kept in touch. Jeremy went to Birmingham University to read Chemical Engineering and Janet went to Glasgow University studying Veterinary Medicine.

Jeremy worked for Unilever for five years and qualified as a Chartered Chemical Engineer. Then he spent four years near Brussels setting up a small manufacturing company, followed by a year studying at INSEAD Business School near Fontainebleau for an MBA. After a period of management consultancy he decided it was not for him, so for the last fifteen years he has been CEO of a series of spin-off biotechnology businesses, four out of the University of Oxford. He describes these businesses, providing novel laboratory instruments, as 'the picks and shovels of the nanotechnology gold rush' and feels his core achievement are the youngsters he has encouraged and trained, most of whom have gone on to satisfying and fulfilling careers.

He and Janet married in 1989, living first in Winterbourne then for thirty years in Marshfield. As he approached retirement they were able to buy a farm in the centre of Littleton, next to Janet's mother who is still living in her own house.



Jeremy learnt to sail at the age of four at Thornbury Sailing Club in Littleton and has remained a member ever since. He is a RYA Dinghy Instructor and competed in the National Championships. He sailed, (age 20), with his father in the disastrous Fastnet Race of 1979 when several people lost their

lives. Their boat rolled over twice, and they failed to finish, but they survived.

A Wayfarer dinghy, for those like me who don't know one boat from another, is an open sailing boat about sixteen feet long, they are used for 'day boat' trips, racing or training. They are not built for the open sea, however in 2014 Jeremy and a friend set out to beat the record of 76 days for sailing a Wayfarer around the British Isles. This they achieved in half the time, 32 days, a great



Remembering Whistling Jimmy Fowler 80 years on.

Tuesday 15th June 2021 is the 80th anniversary of Jimmy Bowkett-Fowler's sad and early death. The full story appeared in Meeting Point in November 2019.

In brief, Jimmy died when a stick of high explosive bombs was dropped from a lone German bomber flying over Olveston. Jimmy was the only civilian war death recorded in the area. His birth certificate records his surname as Bowkett from his mother. she had given him the names of Cyril John. John after her father and the name Cyril may be a link but is just another mystery in his life. After being informally adopted by the local Fowler family, with whom he lodged, Jimmy had taken their surname out of fondness. They had given him the affectionate family name of Jimmy,

which he happily used.

Looking deeper into the story I found that Jimmy's early life and that of his parents is shrouded in mystery due to a lack of accessible records. We know Jimmy was born in Worcester on 25th August 1922. He was well schooled, and this led to a job working for the Bristol Aircraft Corporation in Filton. In 1925 his mother Hilda had married a sailor, John William Greenslade, who was born in Taunton, but had moved with his family to Gloucester as a child. John had joined the Royal Navy in 1918 and became skilled in the use of wireless. He rose steadily in rank and had served until the end of the Second War. Hilda and John had set up home in Shropshire where they had two

children. They both retired to Eastleigh in Hampshire where John died in January 1967, Hilda in June 1980.

His mother seems to have moved on in her life, but I am sure she never forgot her son. Jimmy was by all accounts a happy soul who enjoyed life in Olveston to the full. Aged 18 years at the time of his death, he is at peace in an unmarked grave in the cemetery of St Mary's in Olveston, in the middle of a community which had taken him to their hearts. His death is recorded in parish records and by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission. He should never be forgotten.



- 1 = PET, Polyethylene Terephthalate, and is widely recycled.
- 2 = HDPE, High-Density Polyethylene, and is also widely recycled.
- 3 = PVC, Polyvinyl Chloride, and is capable of being recycled but harder to do so, so check with your local authority.
- 4 = LDPE, Low-Density Polyethylene, also capable of being recycled. but check with your local authority.
- 5 = PP, Polypropylene, hard or impossible to recycle, so try to reuse or avoid it. PP is used in disposable cups, and some food containers.
- 6 = PS, Polystyrene is hard or impossible to recycle, so try to reuse or avoid it. PS is used in disposable coffee cups, plastic cutlery and packing foam.
- 7 = other. This is usually a mix of different plastics which are tricky to recycle.



This one's a bit of a weird one - two interlocking green arrows means that the manufacturers have made a financial contribution to recycling services in Europe. It doesn't mean the product itself is recyclable.

New Plans, New Faces, New Energy Melinda Rackham

As last month's Meeting Point editorial noted, it is a while since there has been any news from the Making

Space for Wildlife project. Like so many things over the last year, we have not been as active as we would have liked, but we have not disappeared. If anything there is a renewed energy in the project, partly because the clamour to restore biodiversity is only getting louder, and partly as we have welcomed new faces to the project.

We are very pleased to say the Parish Council has recently appointed two Councillors to the project, Martyn Suker and Tony Turnbull. This is great news as both Councillors have plenty of experience in conservation both locally and elsewhere. Together, we have been working on a new approach and new plans for the future. We plan to focus on three main areas: habitats, species and community spaces. Some elements under the habitats theme will be familiar to readers of Meeting Point, who may remember our tree planting efforts over the winter of 2019-2020. Our baby trees in the Vicarage Lane playing fields are taking off again this spring, even the two oaks we thought would not make it are determined to hang in there. We will plant more trees over the coming winters, aligned with South Gloucestershire Council's target to plant enough trees by 2030 that will ultimately double tree cover. We will also continue to monitor the grass verges on Aust Road and Old Down Hill which were enhanced with wildflower plug in previous years.

In terms of habitats, we are turning our focus to reduced grass cutting in some areas. This will be a combination of less frequent cutting, as well as leaving some areas to grow long, but don't worry, cutting around junctions for safety and visibility will continue. As mentioned in last month's Meeting Point article, this new cutting regime has become known as a 'Mohican' cut. There will be more information to follow about this in later months, but if you notice some grassed areas appearing less even, and more 'Mohican', it's all to help our wildlife.

On species, for now we plan to focus on hedgehogs and swifts. These much beloved species really do need our extra help now. We will be in touch when we have a little bit more certainty about what we can do and when but suffice to say we are hoping as many people in our community as possible will get involved in little and bigger ways, it all helps to reverse the steep decline in numbers.

We also have plans to improve or create some community spaces dedicated to wildlife. These are all at an early stage right now, but we will keep you up to date as we make progress on the details. ST MARY'S CHURCH TOWER RESTORATION PROJECT

St Mary's Tower Restoration Project

Peter Floyd

Following last month's promise of a start on site we have news, even photos, of blocks of stone which we believe have left the French quarry and expect them soon to arrive in this country. So, I shall stop making promises and, once again, urge you to watch the tower!

Meanwhile, Church Warden Martin Gibson, offers us a glimpse of the passing of time marked by our remarkable church clock.

Time vs Technology

Martin Gibson

Cast your mind back 21 years and we are leaving the 20th century behind. In those one hundred years we learned how to fly, cars became a part of our lives, computers and electronics brought us the refrigerator, the radio and television and the atomic bomb. Now go back into the 19th century when railways, vaccines, telegraph, telephone and the typewriter all appeared. And now back into the 18th century, the era of steam engines, the flush toilet, the piano and the Spinning Jenny.

Cutting edge technology in the early 18th century included the church clock shown on the next page. Cutting edge? The frame is made of beaten metal, the work of a blacksmith; the winding wheels and cables would lift a Centurion tank off the ground. The base is constructed from rough-hewn timbers strong enough to last 1,000 years. This is the mechanism which still powers St Mary's Church tower clock and chime, which must be wound every three days or so.

The clock is a weight-driven engine, large weights gradually fall turning the gears and all this is encased in a 'bird cage'. The clock face and hands are about 10 feet higher up and connected by a metal shaft and gears. The chimes ring every hour for 24 hours. The whole mechanism was made by Dell of Bristol (not the computer company) in around 1770 and overhauled by Boniface and White exactly 50 years ago. These clocksmiths were based in Thornbury High Street and associated with local resident Sir George White.

Property Care & Improvements



For over 250 years men have climbed their way up the narrow, cobwebbed vice tower to reach the bell chamber. In here the laborious task of winding the gear wheels takes place using a metal handle over two feet long. Timing is deliberately set to run slightly fast using assorted coins on the bob. The chime on the hour is achieved by the clock triggering a hammer to strike the rim of the heaviest bell, the 19cwt tenor.

But 21st century technology is now able to replace human effort. There are electronic devices which can wind the clock and regulate it for changes of air pressure, temperature and the wind, all

of which affect its accuracy.

Just one small problem – these improvements will cost about £7,500 and are not part of the Tower Restoration Fund. Money has already been offered for the restoration of the clock face, which will be repainted whilst the tower restoration takes place over the next 12 months. St Mary's is hoping that generous parishioners will find the money for its automation.




