

It's not that swifts love noisy parties (although they do love a bit of screaming), the sound systems will play specially recorded swift calls at dawn and dusk. This method has been used widely across the UK as a way of encouraging swifts to find new homes. So, fingers crossed for this summer, we do hope the swifts will decide to move in!





### Wild Humbugs!

In April this year we spent several days in the Forest of Dean, spending quite a lot of time at the RSPB site at Nagshead. This was primarily to undertake bird watching. However, early evening in one of the hides, on a day which had been very quiet with regards to both people and birds, we heard some shuffling and snorting noises to our right. We looked out the side of the hide and were amazed to see 10 juvenile wild boar. We were very excited by this as neither of us had seen a wild boar before in their natural environment. Wild boar, despite all of their notoriety, are not commonly seen and these were coming right up to our hide and did not appear to know we were there. They apparently have very poor eyesight but very keen sense of smell. They stayed for about five minutes very close to our hide, when they then ran back into the thick brush where we could no longer see them.



Juvenile boar are called piglets, but are also known affectionately as humbugs due to their stripy backs. This provides the piglet with effective camouflage against the backdrop of the forest floor. What was strange was that we saw no evidence of the sow and could only assume that she was close by.

As many will know, a clear sign of wild boar is uprooted and disturbed soil and there was plenty of evidence of that. It is this which gives the wild boar a mixed, or sometimes negative, reputation, especially when they decide to leave the cover of the forest to uproot a cricket pitch or bowling green! Other signs of wild boar are wallows; they will create areas in wet ground to wallow in the mud to clean themselves of parasites and we saw plenty of evidence of that as we walked within the forest, especially areas created around the base of tree stumps.

A wild boar can grow up to 80cms at the shoulder and can weigh 60 – 100kg. They are native to the UK but were hunted to extinction in the wild in the Middle Ages. However, they were bred in captivity for meat, and it was in the 1990s when it is believed some escaped (or were intentionally released) and free-living wild boar were seen again in the wild. They are powerful animals that are covered in bristly hair. The adult male has tusks which protrude, the female also has tusks, but these do not protrude from her mouth. They are omnivores and enjoy many sources of food. During spring and summer they settle in dense woodland to raise their litters, so their diet then consists mainly of root and plant matter. It is during autumn and winter when the wild boar may leave the cover of woodland to seek grasslands which have been softened by rain, to dig up insects to eat. It is then when their conflict with humans is more likely. Wild boar will eat much of what they identify on the forest floor, whilst this is mostly roots, seed and vegetation their diet may also include carrion and small mammals. It is worth noting that the forest supplies ample sources of food for the boar and they should never be fed.



The average size of a litter is 6 – 10 piglets and around birthing time the sow will identify a 'farrowing nest' in the cover of the woodland and close to food. At this time the boar will remain near the nest for around a week, but soon after they will depart and continue their nomadic lifestyle within the forest. Wild

boars live in groups which are known as sounders and this is mainly the adult female and her young. Adult males are solitary, seeking out females in the mating season. The Forest of Dean has the largest breeding population, but boars are present in some parts of southeast and southwest England and also northwest Scotland. They should be treated with some caution as they could become aggressive if they feel threatened, especially if piglets are present. An

adult male or female will guard their young by standing firm by them but are unlikely to attack humans. However best advice is to move slowly and quietly away in the opposite direction. I have heard that due to a wild boar's poor eyesight they may stand and look at you - presumably to determine if you are any threat - however this is not aggressive behaviour. They are much more likely to attack a dog, as from a boar's perspective they are like a wolf which was many years ago one if its predators. So, if walking a dog where there is evidence of wild boar, keep it on a lead (the dog that is).



It is said that wild boar are eco engineers; they shovel the ground in search of food and air the soil, improve its drainage, release the seed of tree and flower seeds within the ground and uproot bracken and bramble which would otherwise shade young plants. However, as they no longer have any natural predators their numbers

are at risk of becoming too high for their environment and therefore, as with deer, they are culled to control numbers, so they are a benefit to the environment and not disruptive to it.

So yes, the piglets were exceptionally cute as they rooted and tooted around us in the bird hide, but it is worth being reminded that they are called wild boar for a reason. It was perhaps fortunate that we were in the bird hide. After that we called it a day, as I don't think much could have upstaged those five minutes! We searched again over the coming days but, apart from the signs of wallows and upended ground, we never heard or saw another wild boar.



## The Last Flight of Sergeant Harold Clinton Cotnam

The date of July 1st may hold special significance for some people. For me it is the anniversary of the start of the infamous 1916 battle of the Somme. To Canadians it has a great significance as it is their National Day. This celebrates a Constitution Act in 1867, which saw three independent territories form the single nation of Canada. The UK has many links with Canada, including a sad one within our area which may not be widely known.



Harold Clinton Cotnam was born on the 13<sup>th</sup> of September 1919 in Pembroke Ontario. He grew up on his parents' farm in the Ottawa Valley. He served in a military cadet force for four years, attaining the rank of corporal. Harold ended his schooling at the prestigious Pembroke Collegiate Institute.

On leaving college aged 18 in the spring of 1937, he obtained a post as a bank clerk in the Royal Bank of Canada. Beginning in Pembroke he was moved to

Brockville and eventually Mount Royal in Quebec. It was here in 1940 that he applied to join the Royal Canadian Air Force. His required testimonials were glowing. His medical examinations were passed with ease. Harold declared that he smoked ten cigarettes a day and drank two beers a week. He stated a wish to become a flying observer, a skilled and highly dangerous position, mainly involved in reconnaissance work, when he began pilot training. He passed written tests with high scores and, flying a number of training aircraft, he progressed well. His flying, landing, instrument work and navigation were of the highest standards. He was described as smart, with a pleasing personality and displaying very good conduct. A concluding report detailed; 'an alert, stable lad who may be a little lacking in self-confidence'. He had no financial or other worries.

As was the norm, in early October 1941, Harold travelled to the UK for further experience, particularly in the skills of aerial combat. He was given the rank of sergeant and was posted to 52 Operation Training Unit based at RAF Aston Down, near Minchinhampton. Here he began solo flying Hawker Hurricane fighter planes. On the afternoon of Friday 31st October Harold took off from Ashton Down on a standard training flight. The top speed of a Hurricane aircraft was 340 mph, so in a matter of minutes he would have been over our area.

Sergeant Frank James of the Gloucestershire Constabulary subsequently took a witness statement from Ronald White, an anti-aircraft gunner serving with the Royal Artillery.

'At about 3 to 3.30 pm on Friday, 31st of October 1941 I was standing at the main doors at Firleaze House, Rudgeway, when I heard a plane overhead, it sounded as though the engine was not working properly. I looked up and the plane came out of the clouds nose first, the whole of the plane would turn halfway and then back again. He did this about four times. The plane went straight to the ground in an almost vertical dive, it went behind the trees and immediately I heard a crash. The plane was not very high when it came out of the clouds, but for a large cloud through which it came, visibility was fair. I am absolutely certain that the engine of the plane was running the whole time it was nose diving to earth.'

Local residents Edward Churchus, William Burgess and Dennis Hicks had witnessed the event and went to the scene to find a wrecked aircraft in a field, described as 200 yards north of Washing Pool Hill. Harold was still with his plane and had died instantly. It seems he may have been able to level out the Hurricane at the last moment but could not avoid the crash.

Harold was carefully stretchered from the field. RAF Filton took over the recovery of the wrecked aircraft, which was deemed a total loss. A Board of Enguiry concluded that the accident had occurred due to loss of control in



cloud and an inability to recover due to the low height of the plane. No criticism of Harold was made. If any signs of the crash remained, over eighty years of farming has buried them deep.

Harold was buried with military honours on November 4<sup>th</sup> in the Commonwealth War Graves Commission plot in Canford Cemetery. He was 22 years of age. He lies at peace amongst comrades, his parents inscribed his grave with the words; 'The strife is over the battle done now is the victor's triumph won'.

He is not forgotten in his hometown of Pembroke Ontario where the War Memorial has a poignant inscription:

'All's well for over there amongst his peers a happy warrior sleeps'.

### Children's Safety Education Centre

A Volunteer



In 2005 I visited the Lifeskills Safety Education Centre in Bristol to find out what it was all about. Eighteen years later and I am still working there as a volunteer

guide and a trainer guide. The hours that I work are entirely up to me, morning, afternoon, or all day. It is a very flexible and enjoyable role.

Lifeskills is a place for children, aged ten to eleven, to visit with their school. It is an interactive village where we have 18 different locations, or sets, which the children go around, usually in groups of four, with a guide. There is a limited time of five minutes on each set which keeps them very busy. In one set they learn about making 999 calls, which is very important as the majority of children have mobile phones these days. Each child will make a 999 call. (These calls are, of course, on our own internal phones). There are other sets covering, for example, safety in the home, drugs, crossing roads safely, safety in the kitchen, fire hazards and shopping. Hazards outdoors are addressed, for example trampolines, skateboards and scooters. There is one covering safety near railway lines which has very effective sounds of a train coming through a tunnel. Also covered is safety around water.

Lifeskills is a lovely place to work, especially if you enjoy working with children. We also have special needs children visit us, which is very rewarding. If anyone is interested to find out more, we run regular taster hours, which is a great introduction to the charity and includes a tour.

The centre is open 9.30am – 12 noon and 12.30pm – 3pm If you are interested in a visit and would like to learn more about becoming a volunteer guide, contact details are as follows:

"Yesterday is history, tomorrow is mystery, today is a gift".


We are all on the journey of life, but one could say nothing is permanent.
