

Another Side of the Glastonbury Festival Mary L.

Well, it's that time of year again - as divisive as Marmite and a microcosm of British summer. The juggernaut that is Glastonbury Festival is revving up and ready to roll. The bands, the crowds, the mud, the traffic and (not least) the toilets are as iconic as Wimbledon, but there's so much more to this famous, indeed infamous, British festival.

For the last few years we've been privileged to work, albeit in very minor roles, during the latter stages of setting up the festival and in the manic scramble of deconstruction. And it's fascinating. Even now, the first thing that hits me on arrival is the sheer enormity of the site, with the 4m high security fence alone taking several weeks to erect. To put it into perspective, if you stood on Tockington Green, the central festival site would spread north to Old Down Country Park, east beyond Sheepcombe, south to the M4 and west to the edge of Olveston. Beyond that main fence, there are fields upon fields of car parking, glamping sites, and compounds for workers and storage.



As with any city of over 200,000 people, the 5 days of the festival will witness joy, sadness, crime, births, marriages, and sadly the occasional death. But, all in all, it's the biggest party you can imagine. There's truly something for everyone. One minute you can be enjoying the gentle harmony of an a capella group, then go round a corner to find

Aust Parish Council

Annual Parish Assembly

We had a busy month in April, with a well-attended Annual Parish Assembly held before our regular parish council meeting. The Annual Assembly is an opportunity for residents to hear about what the parish council has been doing over the past year and to raise any issues which they might want the council to consider over the coming year, as well as a chance to discuss other matters of general interest to residents. These meetings date back many years to when we did not have the many methods of communication which we enjoy now but are still a useful way for residents to keep in touch with the parish council, and vice versa.

At this year's Assembly, our chairman Steve Meredith gave an update on what the council has been up to over the last year and South Glos Council member Matthew Riddle reported on some SGC matters. More details are on the parish council's website at bit.ly/austpc main.

Unfortunately, two of the expected speakers, the local police beat team and the Village Agent, were not able to attend, but we did enjoy an interesting presentation by members of Sustainable Thornbury, on their hopes for developing a community energy scheme in the Thornbury area within the next few years. Planning for this is at an early stage and the type of scheme hasn't yet been determined – it could be wind power, solar, support for more households to install their own renewable technology or something else entirely – but you can find more information via their website www.sustainablethornbury.org/index.php?mylink=communityenergyppt.

Woodwell Meadows

I reported a few months ago that the parish council are looking into formation of a volunteer group to carry out regular management activities at Woodwell Meadows nature reserve in Littleton. This has proved to be rather more involved than we first thought! But we are gradually finding our way through the paperwork and hope to be able to announce a date for an initial working party before too long.

In the meantime, a few of the councillors and I have met with South Glos Council officers at Woodwell, to look at the most important priorities for the site and discuss how the volunteer group might be run. We also donned our work gloves and got stuck into some practical improvements, removing a few of the blackthorn shrubs from the upper meadow. Luckily, the sun shone (yes, it has happened once this year!) and reminded us what a lovely spot Woodwell








Tockington Cross

Nick Fear

The passing of inspirational local historian Eric Garrett was felt by many in the parish. His encyclopedic knowledge was always on hand for advice, and we are lucky that he left his archive which he had collected over the years. Eric's childhood home of Olveston was always foremost in his mind, but then there was Tockington as a close second. Tockington appears as 'Tockintome' in the Doomsday Book. Other writings call it Thokinton, Toketon and Tokinton. The place name may have come from a local Saxon Chief called Tocca who established a village (in Saxon a 'tun') in the area, hence Tocca's Tun.

The Avon Cycle route winds its way through the area and many hundreds - if not thousands - of cyclists use it. Travelling out of Tockington passing Brook Farm towards Fern Hill, I wonder how many realise that they are entering the Moscow Flats. Often mentioned by Eric, the name came from the blast of cold air which hits you once you go round the sharp bend by Brook Farm. The Russian connection may have come from knowledge gained in World War 2 but may also have predated this. Trade with Russia was regular, and mariners' stories tell of Russian boats coming into Bristol and Gloucester docks.

Tockington, the village, has always had a grassy green at its heart. This has given rise to a local name Tockington Green. Legend has an ancient chapel in this area, but this has never been pinpointed. Walls from the village animal pound dating from medieval times can still be seen. To the west side of the Green is a round stone circular structure, now enclosing a small tree and shrubs. It has an outer concentric ring at ground level forming a step. This is however of limited use to gain the height of the structure. What was its original purpose?

One clue may be found in old maps of the area - and from Eric Garrett. Whenever I mentioned Tockington Green, he would smile and point out that there was no such place. Tockington had a green, but the area I was referring to was actually Tockington Cross. In old Ordnance Survey maps the structure is shown as just this, a cross, with an ecclesiastical capital C marking it as an ancient religious site. If instead of a tree, you can imagine a religious cross in its place, the need for a kneeling step below it makes sense. A worshiper on their knees in prayer or contemplation has long been a Christian practice. A cross at the centre, most likely made of wood, would eventually degrade and fall. With high replacement costs, or perhaps no local demand for a new cross, replacing it with a tree was perhaps an obvious answer.

Several local people recall having seen an image of a cross at Tockington, but to date no copy of this image has been found. However, there are many photographs from across the years of trees of different sizes within the stone circle, some of which were funded and supported by local community groups.

Passing through Tockington you may think about animals gathered together in the village pound. You might experience the spiritual side of Tockington Cross. Going out of the village you may feel the icy blast from Moscow Flats. Experiences like this take us back to times past and remind us of the history in our area which Eric recorded so thoroughly.

Mandy de la Mare

Mandy and Steve moved to Olveston four years ago, you may remember Councillor Steve was profiled last month. It has been a long journey to this point with many ups and downs, but they are so happy to be here, having found the perfect house for their needs and a welcoming community.

Briefly, as Mandy has spoken to several local groups already, she was born in 1962 and is one of 460 or so who survived the Thalidomide disaster. All suffered various disabilities; Mandy's arms are missing, she required



extensive surgery on her hips as a child which successfully allowed her to walk, and her left eye was missing, the other partially formed; eventually it suffered a detached retina and was finally removed in 2010. She hates people feeling sorry for her - so read on!

In 2010 the government made a formal apology to Thalidomide beneficiaries and

agreed a one-off pilot payment of £20 million to the Thalidomide Trust. Mandy lived in Kingswood, Bristol at this time and used her share of the money to build an extension which enabled her to regain some independence.

Mandy has been married twice and has three children and five grandchildren. (Mandy is pictured with her children above) In 2014 her daughter Freya was showing signs of autism and starting senior school. This did not go well, and she was officially diagnosed on the autistic spectrum requiring special help in 2016. Sadly, this was not forthcoming; she had a breakdown in 2019 and did not return to school. Mandy was recommended Hedgeways, a college run by Aurora, on Pilning Street, Freya started there in 2019 and, as they say, the rest is history. It was the best thing they ever did, she blossomed in the quiet

countryside, was able to learn and left in 2021 to go to SGS College to further her education.

While Freya was at Hedgeways, the commute from Kingswood to Pilning Street took one and a half hours each way, which was untenable, so Mandy and Steve house hunted in this area. As soon as they saw the house in Hardy Lane, Steve could see its potential. Mandy sold her house in Kingswood in 2019 and the date for completion was the end of March 2020. However, the day before the move, COVID lockdown struck, and they were held up until May. They eventually moved in during the partial lockdown. Luckily Steve's family and connections were able to start alterations immediately. Freya has a self-contained annexe in the old barn which will hopefully have a little kitchen added this year. The barn also sports a disco room for parties. The main house is almost finished, with just the garden to go.

Steve and Mandy have known each other since teenagers and now, with two marriages apiece, they have found one another again and Mandy says this is one of the best things to happen in her life. She is assisted by a team of three personal assistants and has an ensuite bathroom again to allow her to shower and dress herself. When Freya asked for a puppy, Odin the golden retriever became part of the family. Freya walks him - but otherwise parents have taken over, as is usual! She says this is the best move ever, as they are surrounded on five sides by lovely neighbours and with a friendly pub round the corner. She has received a warm welcome from the WI and St Mary's Church, and they have got to know more people in four years here than she did in forty years in Kingswood.



Since 2004 Mandy has been heavily involved with the Thalidomide trust as a Volunteer Visitor, supporting fellow beneficiaries with any problems eg marital, bereavement, benefits, adaptations and IT. She will happily talk to any interested group about living with Thalidomide.

The last word comes from Mandy:

'I don't want anyone to feel sorry for me because I don't! I am what I am, and I don't blame anyone for it. Yes, it should never have happened, but the blame game is a very negative one. So I always look at what I have gained from being what I am and clearly I have certainly learnt to be patient, understanding and forgiving as life is too short.'

in nearly all living organisms. An increased amount of light at night lowers melatonin production, which results in a variety of other health problems. Artificial night lighting causes birds in the city to become active earlier than birds in natural areas - waking and singing as much as five hours sooner than their country cousins. Even animals living under the sea may be affected by underwater artificial lighting. Insects, a primary food source for birds and other animals, are also affected.

Here are some principles which could be adopted to reduce light pollution where you live.

- 1) Install lighting only when and where it's needed.
- 2) Shield your lights so they shine down on the ground.
- 3) Use lights that are no brighter than necessary
- 4) Use timers, dimmers, and motion sensors on outdoor lights.

June 5th is World Environment Day, which is when we observe the wildlife visiting our gardens for 'Let it Bloom in June' following 'No Mow May'.

The whole month of June is '30 Days Wild'. which was created by the Wildlife Trusts to help everyone be more connected with nature by doing something 'wild' every day. When you sign up, you're sent a digital pack with ideas for you and your family. https://www.wildlifetrusts.org/sign-30-days-wild



Father George Malecki Christ the King, Thornbury

Travel by motorway is reckoned to be the safest form of travel for the average motorist. Accidents seldom happen. However, when they do, they tend to be quite serious. And another hazard is then created - people slowing down to take a look. The popular expression for this is: 'rubbernecking'. A police officer on the scene will often be on hand to signal drivers to keep moving, to concentrate on the job in hand - driving safely.

As the season of Easter has now drawn to a close, the Scriptures tell us how, as Jesus ascended into the heavens, his friends stood "staring into the sky": that is, until two angelic figures appeared, gently urging them to move on. There is work to do – a mission to fulfil. For forty days since his resurrection, Jesus had been with them constantly. Now, as they gazed into the sky, they must surely have experienced mixed feelings. He was leaving them. No longer would they be buoyed up by his visible presence. Yet they knew that he was returning in his humanity to his beloved Father, completing the triumph begun by his Resurrection. And they were sure, as the Gospel puts it, that the Lord would be "working with them" as they went out to preach and baptise. Moreover, they had the assurance that this was no final goodbye. One day he would return. They are instructed to wait a little longer for the coming of the Holy Spirit. That would launch them as his "witnesses ... to the ends of the earth". On the day of the Lord's Ascension into heaven, it is the joy of the occasion that is captured as they await that coming of the Holy Spirit.

Today we are invited to raise our voices in praise of the Lord who has ascended to his heavenly throne as King of kings. Our gathering in his name is itself a sign that we want to respond to the invitation. We want to praise our Lord for his personal triumph. We want to thank him too because of the hope that he has brought to us, the "rich glories" he promises and the power, which Saint Paul describes as "infinitely great". And yet we must not stop there. To do so might be described as a type of spiritual rubbernecking, being so fascinated with these spiritual realities that we become distracted and lose sight of the bigger picture.

Jesus' final words at his Ascension into heaven were that we should spread the Good News, that we should be his witnesses. And that is a task we, fulfil principally by the way we live our lives each day. The Bible may speak of some of the marvels associated with those early believers, but we too, both believer and non-believer, in our own small, less dramatic ways, also bear witness to the Lord's message. We do that by our patience, our acts of kindness, our concern, our readiness to forgive, our joy, our humble living out of the Gospel. In so doing, we too are living signs confirming that Jesus has risen, and has ascended, and is indeed Lord.
