



### James Farr

In 1907 James's great grandfather, also called James, bought twenty-six acres of land in Tockington, opposite the Parish Hall, and the family have farmed it ever since. They have a map with the title deeds of the land and the names of their neighbouring landowners. James's mission has been to make the farm work, and, with purchases, the land now totals 240 acres.

The house on the site was initially called Paradise Place but changed its name in the 1880s to The Elms - James and his wife Vanessa have considered changing the name back! It was sub divided into flats for many years, but James and Vanessa renovated it in 2020 to become a family home for them and their daughters. A historic survey shows that parts of the house date back to the 1660s.

In the 1990s his father Bruce ran a poultry farm, but new regulations necessitated a change. He therefore set about diversifying with the chicken sheds becoming storage units and the other buildings became mixed use. The largest, Avon Tuning, which modifies car engines, was started by a local lad and now employs ten people. Others include a Caribbean bakery supplying local markets, a metal worker and an 'Up Cycler' of furniture.

Farming is still the common denominator with commercial cattle and sheep and a few chickens. James' family own Old Down Woods in the Slad which have been slightly neglected recently due to all the new activity but is sometimes used for groups of young children and local dog walkers. A small wood near the house is the home of a Woodland School started three years ago by Elise Goard,

(www.woodlandmakery.com). It is used by Olveston Pre-School and Jigsaw, a charity supporting children and young adults with special needs.

Recently friends Debs and Roz asked if they could expand their organic flower business, The Wild Zinnia, in the derelict part of the

garden. All rubbish was removed, the soil cultivated, and now they grow flowers all the year round with the aid of a greenhouse. They sell online at wildzinniabristol @gmail.com, they also do weddings and sell to local florists.



Sustainability is important to James - his other grandfather was a pioneer of the Soil Association and had a big impact on him on visits to their farm. The chicken sheds have solar panels and last year he planted six hundred broadleaf trees. with the aid of a few local volunteers.

James is glad to carry on the family farming tradition, of course there is diversification, but farming is still at the core. This combination has developed a nice



### Emma Pattullo Clerk to Aust Parish Council



I grew up in the north of Scotland, moved south for university (and some warmer weather) and now live in Rangeworthy with my husband and two teenagers. Outside work I am a member of Rangeworthy WI, I volunteer in my local primary school and have just started a Spanish language class, so my life is certainly busy.

I've been a parish council clerk for seven years, having held the same role with Oldbury-on-Severn Parish Council before moving to Aust PC. I started my current role in summer 2020, a very strange time to start a new job as everything was being run over Zoom, including my interview and my first few council meetings.

It was great to finally meet the councillors face to face once we were allowed to do so.

The role of parish clerk, and parish councils, is often misunderstood. Firstly, we are nothing to do with the church; parish councils are the most local branch of government and exist to represent and improve their local communities. Parish councillors are not paid, they carry out the role to help their communities. In a smaller parish like Aust, which also covers Elberton and Littleton, the parish council is largely focused on representing the interests of our residents in dealing with other bodies such as South Glos. Council, but in larger parishes and towns, local councils also provide many services such as grass cutting or playgrounds.

My clerk role covers far more than it might first appear. Although I do run the administration of the council — such as drawing up the agendas for council meetings, taking minutes and dealing with many, many emails — I am also the council's accountant, legal advisor, planning specialist, human resources department, IT support, communications officer and general 'chief cook and bottle washer' as my Gran would have said. In short, the councillors might make the decisions, but I'm the one who gets things done (sorry, councillors!)

The best thing about my job is that it can be incredibly varied. One day I might be looking at a planning application for a new development, whilst the next I could be learning about legislation for the protection of badgers on our nature reserve at Woodwell Meadows. There is always something new to learn, although thankfully my experience has now made the unexpected surprises a little less common.

### A Trip to 10 Downing Street

Out of the blue I received an invitation to a reception in June, to thank me for the work I do locally. An even bigger surprise was that it would be taking place at Number 10 Downing Street. At first, I was a bit hesitant about attending, as it felt like a long way to go for quite a short event, especially given the costs involved and the carbon footprint of such an adventure. However, we wanted to visit my mother-in-law in Berkshire, and doing that meant I would already be more than halfway to London, so I said yes to this rare opportunity to visit such a well-known location.

Downing Street is located off Whitehall, nearly opposite the Cenotaph, and it struck me that it

is really quite a narrow street, with white stone buildings towering up on either side. The four well-armed police guarding the black metal gates leading into the street sent a powerful message. Passing through security meant a thorough check of my official invitation and photo ID, then all my loose possessions went into a tray and through a scanner, before I also stepped through an electronic security device. Interestingly, this was much more rigorous than when going to a Buckingham Palace Garden Party a few years ago, as I recall, back then, only having to show my invitation at the gate.

The door of Number 10 Downing Street is physically very much like any other door, though very gleaming and very black, but it was not as heavy as I had imagined. I reflected that I had actually entered a 'Number 10' door many times before in my life. Firstly, my Granny Riddle's door at 10 Eastland Road, and then my late parents' door at 10 Westmarsh Lane. This particular Number 10 however was unlike any other doorway I have ever stepped through! The weight of history was everywhere. I walked through the hallway behind the famous door, where all guests had to leave any mobiles or cameras, then down a corridor and onto the main staircase. The walls of these stairs are famously adorned by the black and white portraits of all previous Prime Ministers, which stretch upwards in chronological order from the first Prime Minister, Robert Walpole who took office in 1721, to the most recent former holders of the office, at the top.

One of those pictured Prime Ministers who is of particular local interest is Robert Jenkinson, the Second Earl of Liverpool, whose family came from

Hawkesbury, and who lived at Eastwood Park, Falfield. At 42 years old he was one of the youngest to take up the role, and, in office for almost 15 years, he was also one of longest serving Prime Ministers. During his tenure, from June 1812 to April 1827, he had some tricky situations to sort out. The King, George III, was suffering with a mental illness and his son (whom the King did not get on with at all) was Prince Regent from 1811 until George III died in 1820. The Corn Laws were a hot potato, and the Prime Minister also had to deal with civil unrest after the end of the Napoleonic Wars in 1815, and debates about Catholic emancipation. He died in 1828 and was buried in Hawkesbury Church beside his first wife and his father.

To get to the Rose Garden, where the reception took place, you actually go down the main stairs and then out onto a beautiful wide lawn surrounded with roses, shrubs, and a high sheltering brick wall. Outside it was a very sunny afternoon. I was glad to have taken my straw hat, one of only two straw hats to be seen amongst about a hundred of us there. The garden, like the house, was very well kept, as you would expect. It was good to meet councillors from all over the country and discuss the common issues which we are all dealing with. After the speeches, the Prime Minister mingled with some of those present. He did not come my way, but he looked in very good form, and is shorter and slimmer than I had previously thought.

### Green Force

Biodiversity is all the different kinds of life you'll find in one area, such as animals, plants, fungi, and even microorganisms like bacteria, that make up our natural

world. All these work together in ecosystems, like an intricate web, to maintain balance and support life. Biodiversity supports everything in nature that we need in order to survive, such as food, clean water, medicine, and shelter. The more diverse the ecosystem the more stable it is. We humans put increasing pressure on the planet, using and consuming more resources than ever before, therefore upsetting the balance of ecosystems and losing biodiversity. Both the land-based environment and the ocean environment have been significantly altered because of our needs and human greed.

Our world population continues to increase so that more than 33% of the world's land surface and nearly 75% of freshwater resources are now devoted to crop or livestock production for our food requirements. Humans have overfished the oceans, cleared forests, polluted water sources, and created a climate crisis. These actions are impacting biodiversity around the world, from the most remote places on the planet to our own backyards.

Since 1970, WWF has found an average 69% decline in global populations of mammals, fish, birds, reptiles, and amphibians. In 2019 Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services reported 1 million animal and plant species are now threatened with extinction - the highest number in human history. Climate change completes the circle by worsening the impact of other stressors on nature and our own well-being.

So, what can we do to help the situation? We must think carefully about doing our best not to waste food, grow bee-friendly plants, support local food production to reduce airmiles and conserve energy. If we try all these things, and more, even in a small way, we can make a difference.






