

Diary of a Daisy

Driving Miss Daisy is a relatively new business advertising in Meeting Point. We have asked the owner, Louise Bradforth, to let us know what sort of work she undertakes.

I've now been operating for just over three months. Typical clients have been mainly elderly members of the community, often with mobility issues, however the age range does vary. For example, I've had the lovely experience of helping a young adult with Downs attend her weekly coached swimming session. I watch in awe as I know if I tried to do the butterfly stroke I'd just drown. I was also delighted to have been booked by a lady with an electric wheelchair as transport on her wedding day. If you have a sparkly bride, then you must add sparkles to your vehicle, so my husband kindly helped me attach bows and ribbons to the car.

I am also becoming increasingly aware, through assisting clients, of how mental health issues impact on people's daily lives and what a struggle it can be for those with 'invisible' disabilities. One particular client really benefits from walking with me in 'safe' green spaces: He isn't able to do this on his own but finds being assisted to visit such spaces enables him to manage his condition much better.

On a lighter note, I was searching for a fun activity for a client in her 90s. She has mobility issues and hasn't been able to leave her house, other than for medical appointments, for about 18 months. She mentioned that she remembered seeing donkeys from the local donkey sanctuary at a Christmas nativity. I contacted the sanctuary on the off chance that a visit might be possible, but even better than that, they kindly suggested afternoon tea with the donkeys. We fed the donkeys and enjoyed afternoon tea in their stables with much chatter and braying. One donkey stuck its tongue out when it wanted another biscuit!



One of my favourite bookings so far was introducing two elderly ladies to each other – each fancied new conversation and a change of scene - so they met over morning coffee (rather like a blind date!) They got on well and have been meeting regularly ever since. One of their best outings was to The Wave - they'd heard all about it so, after a lovely lunch at the Bowl Inn, we visited. It's a great spot for

coffee and watching surfers, even in your 90s.



Nature's Wonderful World

Whilst this spring and summer have continued to bring about so many changes to people's lives due to the pandemic, nature has continued its annual life cycle and has brought a lot of happiness to many of us. By the time you read this we will be on the cusp of winter, and spring and summer may feel like a distant memory. So, I thought it would be good to share some of my personal highlights - and photographs - from this period.



Early spring brought about an abundance of bird song and activity across all the Meeting Point area, as it marked the beginning of the mating and nesting season. Birds such as chiffchaffs, dunnocks, chaffinches and tits were highly audible and busy feeding and nest building. There seemed to be increased numbers of flocks of long tailed tits this year,

especially blue tits. Buzzards soared in the skies on clear blue days, a glorious sight. (The photograph above was taken on The Common, Olveston.) In our garden we had regular visits to the feeders from goldfinches and greater spotted woodpeckers. We also had an unusual visitor for several days, a female siskin

Swifts, swallows and house martins began to return from their annual migration. Swifts being the first to arrive and then the first to leave. In Olveston there were fantastic flight displays from those nesting in the school roof and these were followed shortly by house martins soaring across the village. Swallows, who have for many years, nested in a local barn did not return last year and this year arrived only in very small numbers and very late in the breeding season. They did not arrive until almost mid-July and departed late August, therefore had the opportunity for only one brood, which appeared successful as numbers increased before they departed. On their departure date I observed a huge flock over Church Hill and The Common, feeding, and then within moments they were gone. I can only assume this was a developing flock on its winter migration journey.

Over several weeks in May and June a red kite was flying southwards across the Elberton fields early in the day and returning across fields west of Olveston early evening. Very sadly I could not get a good photograph of it. I do not know where it was nesting, but it would be interesting to find out. Sparrowhawks were observed on several occasions hunting across fields on The Common,

Olveston, and Awkley. Rooks were busy making their nesting colonies in woodlands and providing some wonderful arial displays over Catherine Hill.

In May our local deer population seemed to be flourishing and they were busy losing their winter coats and rearing their young. On several occasions, whilst sitting quietly close to wooded areas where there were long grasses, I saw some very young roe deer basking in the sunshine with their mothers.



This year, in very early spring, frogs laid their spawn, which hatched into tadpoles and metamorphosed into froglets. The frog in the photograph, which



was taken in our pond in August, will soon be hibernating for winter although we have seen it foraging on warm autumn days. In our pond, over the breeding season of spring and summer, we had at least two pairs of smooth newts. They, like the frogs, have now left the pond to shelter in damp areas of the garden, but hopefully will return to the pond again next

spring. However - out of the pond - both frogs and newts will help to keep our slug and snail population under control without the use of pesticides.




Around the area the dragonfly and damselfly populations seemed healthy and active as we moved into summer.

Searching for food and mates, I observed broad bodied chasers, emperors, southern hawkers, migrant hawkers, common darters, azure damsels, large red damsels.

These were seen laying their eggs into ponds, ditches, and

rhines. The dragon fly in the photograph above is a male broad bodied chaser and was taken near our pond resting on the tip of a foxglove. Its flight is fast

and erratic, and it was constantly leaving its perch to fly across the pond at high speed and returning to exactly the same spot each time. This was done to protect his area, feed on insects and to attract a mate - which he did. It is the dragonfly's wing structure which enables it to be so powerful in flight.

At Harnhill, a colony of pyramidal orchids were growing, followed by what I believe to be southern marsh orchids. However, I am not 100% certain on the latter. Perhaps if any botanists are reading this, they could identify them when they flower again next year? Pyramidal orchids were originally a flower of



chalk and limestone areas but have now successfully spread and colonies can be seen in a range of environments such as reclaimed land. I was very surprised to come across these. The photograph was taken mid-June.



It has been quite difficult to decide what to feature in this article. As Meeting Point readers may know, I have developed an interest in butterflies which have been very successful locally this year. However, I'm going to end with a hedgehog, which has been resident in our garden for about a month, having arrived at the beginning of September. I have never

seen one in our garden before, so it is another very welcome visitor. As requested by 'Making Space for Wildlife', I have logged it at the following address: olvestonhedgehogs@gmail.com, where this survey will help us gain a better understanding of our local hedgehog population.

I titled this article 'Nature's Wonderful World' and I really do believe we have a wonderful and diverse habitat in the Meeting Point area. But the overriding message is that we must look after this habitat and develop it further in our gardens and the local area, to encourage nature to flourish.


Speed Cameras Report





Already the shops are displaying Christmas wares, and there will be some who are checking that they have the ingredients for making Christmas cakes and puddings. The last Sunday in November (the Sunday next before Advent) is known as Stir-Up Sunday – the traditional day for everyone in the family on their return from church to take a turn at stirring the Christmas pudding mixture while making a wish. Puddings were made at home a month before Christmas so that the flavours had plenty of time to mature. The pudding mixture was always stirred from East to West in honour of the Wise Men who visited the baby Jesus, and it was supposed to contain 13 ingredients to represent Christ and his disciples. Most recipes today are much richer, but I have one from Mrs Beeton which 'religiously' sticks to thirteen! On their way back from church children often chanted: 'Stir up, we beseech thee, the pudding in the pot and when we get home, we'll eat the lot!' The words were adapted from the Collect, which they had heard earlier in the service that morning:

Stir up, we beseech thee, O Lord: the wills of thy faithful people; that they, plenteously bringing forth the fruit of good works, may of thee be plenteously rewarded; through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.

Whatever our faith, or none, we should be charitable in as many ways as we can, particularly as we prepare to celebrate Christmas in a few weeks' time which will be a tough time for many families in the present economic climate.
