

Winter on our Allotment

Our allotment is a year-round project. No two years are ever the same. Over the past 10 years our approach has changed significantly. Whilst the purpose of the allotment is to grow flowers and vegetables, we now balance that with providing an allotment which increases biodiversity. We use no pesticides or herbicides as we have found with a balanced approach of naturally occurring wildflowers, the planting of native and non-native flowers, as well as vegetables, that there is no need to use additional control measures.



Increasingly we allow wildflowers to grow in a semi organised way! (Please note, this picture was not taken on our allotment!) Some of the less dominant species we keep in the ground to provide seed and food matter for wildlife over winter, as well as providing hibernation sites

for a variety of insects who will all present themselves early next spring as we begin to plant for the summer. Early wildflowers, such as dead nettle, also provide essential feeding opportunities for pollinators in early spring.

We grow a selection of winter vegetables such as, winter and spring cabbage, sprouts, carrots, leeks and parsnip and in autumn we plant crops such as garlic and winter onions. The earth is kept open throughout winter. One of the things we do which provides us with great amusement is every Christmas morning, rain or shine, we pick our first crop of winter vegetable for dinner. It makes it all worthwhile.

On a rotational basis we add nutrition to the soil either through green manure or standard manure from the heap at the allotment. This year we are experimenting by creating a long open compost with the intention to plant squashes in it, either next season or the season after (an idea we saw on Gardeners World recently). For us winter is an important part of the annual cycle of events at the allotment, even if it means getting wet and cold on occasions.

The Remarkable Nurse May Fowler

On 27th November 1915, the Bristol Times and Mirror published a two-page spread entitled 'Olveston and the War Call, the following have responded to call of King and Country'. Below were the names of 127 locals, with regiments, bordered by their images. One photo in particular stood out, as it was of a fresh-faced young woman called Nurse May Fowler, who was 'at the front'.



Nurse May Fowler, (At the front)

Mary Ann May Fowler was born in Aust on April 15th, 1889. She was educated locally, living with her family in a cottage near Manor Farm. Her grandmother Emma was a country nurse and May followed in her footsteps. The 1911 census records her as a nurse at Camberwell Infirmary in London. At the outbreak of war in 1914, May volunteered for nursing services abroad, giving her address as Rose Cottage Tockington and her mother Elizabeth as her next of kin.

Travelling to France on October 28th, 1914, she worked in two military hospitals near Boulogne on the northern French coast. These were receiving hospitals for war wounded, the sites of which today are marked by large war cemeteries. The sights May saw and the care she administered can only be imagined. May's nursing qualities were recognised by a promotion to the rank of Sister.

Reports described her as 'a good ward sister, energetic, reliable, temperate and punctual.' She had plenty of common sense and above all was good with patients.

The staffing of military nursing in The Great War came from a mixture of trained nurses and several voluntary units. The backbone of the organisation came from the Queen Alexandra's Royal Military Nursing Service (Q.A.R.M.N.S.). This was formed in 1902, but its origins can be traced back to the work of Florence Nightingale in the Crimean War. There were strict criteria for selection imposed with army correctness by experienced, respected and sometimes feared, matrons. Nurses had to be single women of good social standing between 25 and 35 years of age. They needed to show that they had trained for three years at one of only 34 UK hospitals approved by the Nursing Board. May's nursing abilities and suitability made her a prime candidate and, after encouragement, on April 10th, 1915, she joined the service. She was issued with a uniform featuring the distinctive bright red collar to its cape.

Although the battle lines were miles away, the war also harried the French coast. Zeppelin and aircraft raids caused many casualties, and several cemeteries still care for the graves of nursing staff. The nursing hours worked were excessive and often exceeded planned rosters determined by need. This took a toll on staff and May had a brief period of sick leave in the autumn of 1916. From France she was transferred to southern England and eventually at her request to London. There is a hint in records that the privations from her nursing may have had a negative effect on her health. She battled on and continued to serve beyond the end of the war, eventually being demobilised on July 26th, 1920. Being placed on a nursing reserve list, May returned home to Rose Cottage in Tockington to recuperate in the care of her mother.


It was not long before she was looking to the future and a return to nursing. She may also have realised that she wanted to explore the wider world again. Her career training, stopped by the war, began again and in February 1921 May qualified as a midwife, but there were no vacancies in the military nursing world. In February 1922 May was offered a nursing post in the Shanghai Municipal Council and she left London bound for Yokohama a month later. Returning home after this adventure, in July 1924, she took a boat from Plymouth to New York for a brief visit. She then nursed for the engineering firm of Sir George McAlpine on the Gold Coast of Africa for six months.

By the end of 1925 May had returned to England and briefly to military nursing in Millbank Hospital London. At the beginning of 1928 she had undertaken a housekeeping course at University College London, qualifying her for more senior nursing work. At the end of the year, she took the demanding post of night superintendent at Hackney hospital. In early 1929 she moved to work at Fulham and Lewisham hospitals, still giving Rose Cottage as her home address.

In April 1930 May took the post of Assistant Nursing Superintendent at Lady Harding Hospital in New Delhi India. The testimonials about her abilities for this position were as professionally glowing as they had always been. However, on October 30th, 1930, May wrote to the matron in charge of the Q.A.R.M.N.S to inform her that she was no longer nursing. In September she had married Captain Charles Allen Tice of the Indian Army in Bareilly, India. The matron replied, informing her that as she was now married, she had been removed from the military nursing rolls. The board thanked May for her past services and expressed good wishes for her future happiness.

With war looming she returned to England, leaving Charles in India. In 1939 she settled in Torquay, taking an active part in the local A.R.P administration. When Charles retired at the end of the war he joined May, and they moved to Paignton. Charles died there in January 1967 aged 78, May in April 1970 aged 81. Nurse May Fowler, was indeed a remarkable local woman.

Stories of Bristol Women

Jane Duffus is an author, editor, journalist and founder in 2012 of the 'What the Frock!' comedy project, which staged almost 70 events in seven UK cities, with more than 100 female comedians.

Jane has compiled three books called 'The Women who Built Bristol'. Each book contains short profiles of 250 ordinary and extraordinary women who

have lived in or had links to Bristol.

Of her first book, 'The Women Who Built Bristol 1184 - 2018', Helen Pankhurst - (granddaughter of Sylvia and great-granddaughter of Emmeline Pankhurst) said:

"Jane Duffus and fellow contributors of The Women Who Built Bristol introduce us to a glorious and eclectic set of women who are linked to Bristol. This is a wonderful reminder of the texture of women's lives and their influence in every sphere – something historical accounts often forget. I hope other cities also follow suit."

Following on from the 500 women already

profiled in Volumes One and Two, another 250 women feature in Vol. Three. which came out in March this year.

The women profiled include: the two girls thrown over the Clifton Suspension Bridge by their desperate father (spoiler alert: they survived); the prominent portrait photographer with strong suffrage ideals; the women who lived in a cemetery for more than 100 years; the greengrocer who sold the very first bananas in Bristol... and a woman who quite literally built (bits of) Bristol by virtue of owning a building company. Plus 243 others.

Come along and find out which women Jane chooses to tell us about. And I'm sure she'll bring some of her books along, in case you want to buy one and read more. The books are £15 each (or buy all three for £40, saving £5); Jane welcomes cash and card payments.





We have found the Y2C bus very useful, such as for shopping in Thornbury and going to the doctors in Almondsbury. This is particularly useful for getting to Parkway Station and Southmead Hospital, or to Severn Beach at times not covered by the 918.

Details of alternative ways of using this service are given on the notices on bus stops. You can use an App, but I prefer to do it the 'old fashioned' way by phoning a human on *01174578561*. The first time you use it you must register – they then have your phone number and send you text messages on when your bus will arrive. Both the Y2C and the On Demand are free if you have a Diamond Travelcard.



Autumn at Thornbury & District Museum

A new exhibition is now open – Thornbury: A Garrison Town, WW2. Our district played an important, perhaps unexpected, role in the Second World War, as it hosted a significant military presence throughout the war years.



The exhibition looks at the various units which passed through the area, especially Thornbury's 'own regiment' – a little-known and unusual section of the Royal Artillery that was raised in the town and taken into the hearts of the residents.

What impact did the presence of hundreds of troops and the military aspects of the war have on the lives of the civilians? The exhibition features personal accounts remembering the armed forces, the fall of Dunkirk, aircraft crashes,

the arrival of the 'Yanks', the build-up and effects of D-Day, and much more.



In our upstairs exhibition room, a related exhibition, "My Dear Mum", concerns the Harwich evacuees who stayed in Thornbury during the war. Their stories are told using personal letters, oral histories, photographs and other sources such as school logbooks. This should be of great interest to local schoolchildren learning about child evacuation. We also now have another, smaller display in our Coins Room which looks at Education in Thornbury.

The Museum is in Chapel Street and is open on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays 1pm - 4pm and on Saturdays 10am-4pm. Entry is free. Cont/......



Green Force

Rivers have been flowing for billions of years. They have seen many civilizations and empires rise and fall. The very first civilizations were born on the fertile floodplains of

African and Asian rivers like the Nile and the Euphrates. Rivers were borders and transportation routes and they stimulated industrial development. The ceaseless energy of rivers has long been used for watermills and for trade, but the intense exploitation didn't start until the 20th century. Watercourses have been altered using dams for hydroelectric power.

However, a river that is unexploited represents the best defence and the most efficient system to protect against seasonal floodings. Natural aquatic plants in water and along riverbanks successfully remove organic and mineral pollution pouring into the water from fields, industry or human settlements. The effect of climate change on rivers is profound. The flow of rivers is primarily governed by a combination of precipitation, temperature, and land usage. Any alteration to these elements through human activity or global warming can upset the normal equilibrium and ecosystem of a river. Intense rainfall leads to increased runoff, altering a river's flow patterns.

The reforesting of river catchment areas to slow down runoff, restoring wetlands that act as natural sponges, and even allowing rivers to meander once more, can restore a river's equilibrium. Droughts can diminish water levels affecting everything from local agriculture and public water supplies to wildlife habitats .Both scenarios are increasingly common in a warming world.

The economic implications of altered river flows not only affect agriculture, but also tourism, fishing, and energy supplies, all of which are dependent on the health of rivers. The future of rivers worldwide lies not only in scientific research but in the hands of those who recognise the importance of their environment. Together, the health of our rivers can be sustained and conserved.

The clocks have recently gone back an hour, and the nights are quickly beginning to draw in. Darkness seems to arrive earlier each day. On grey, dreary afternoons, it barely feels like daylight ever truly breaks through. In the parts of the villages where there are only a few - or even no - streetlights, once it gets dark everything fades into shadow except for the flicker of lights behind drawn curtains and the passing beams of car headlights. It feels as if the darkness has wrapped itself around us.

Listening to the news these days, it's easy to feel that this is a reflection of the world we live in. A lot of darkness and times when the light doesn't quite seem to get through. It is a reminder that for many of us, at some point in our lives, darkness seems to overwhelm us, we feel numb, lost, weary and can see no hope and certainly no light. In the Bible, in John chapter 8 verse 12, we read these familiar words that Jesus proclaims,

"I am the Light of the world; those who follow Me will not walk in the darkness, but will have the Light of life"

Jesus spoke these words during the Feast of Tabernacles in Jerusalem. As part of the celebration, priests lit four towering candelabras in the Temple's Court of the Women. This commemorated the fact that God had been with His people as a pillar of cloud by day and of fire by night to protect and guide them as they journeyed through the difficult and desolate wilderness for 40 years. That cloud first appeared when Israel fled Egypt, standing as a barrier between them and Pharaoh's armies on the night before they crossed the Red Sea. Then as it went with them through the wilderness, it was a vivid symbol of divine protection and guidance, of the fact that God was with His people.

So, when Jesus stood near those blazing torches and declared Himself the Light of the world, He was reminding us that just as God was with the Israelites in their darkest, most uncertain days, He is with us now. No matter how bleak and dark life may seem, Jesus shines in our darkness - and overcomes it.
