

My parents will confirm that I have been obsessed with cars since before I could walk, and later, when most of my friends at school were chasing footballs, I was helping my dad in his garage in Eastville and attending



American car shows in the rumble seat of mum's 1939 Buick Roadster, pictured here on the left.

When I first attended Olveston Primary School in 1973, my dad had a small garage in Bristol specialising In American Cars. I will always remember rocking up to school

in a big red Pontiac with a black stripe down the bonnet and a white convertible roof. Everyone was aghast when, at the flick of a button, the colossal roof opened like a missile silo before hiding itself neatly in the boot (or should I say trunk as it was after all an American car?) Another great childhood memory entails me at the age of five sitting in the back of my dad's Aston Martin DB5 convertible in the middle of a thunderstorm, returning from school to our home in Aust. A car that cost him a sultry £1000 and is now worth over a million! (Fortunately, he has seen the light and now drives a Skoda)

My time at Lunn Poly/TUI included a break, during which I spent a short spell working for Volkswagen /Audi in Cheltenham as a Salesperson. This was followed by several years of running my own chauffeur company called 'Go Gazelle '. Unfortunately, after the 1st Gulf war hit in 1991, most of my customers (who were American) stopped travelling to the UK so I returned to the travel industry.

The point is, in all this time, my passion for cars has never waned. Even before I started my own business selling cars, I worked out I had owned over 70 cars starting with my humble Hillman Imp. Over the years friends, family and workmates would come to me for help buying or selling their car and it soon got to a point where too many of the cars in TUI/Thomson Head office car park had passed through my hands at some point. With a total of twenty-six people answering to me directly, and the complicated politics of a company that was constantly restructuring, I decided to leave TUI and start buying/selling cars for a living.



The first few years were difficult. It's a very different ball game when you turn your hobby in to a vocation, but in truth it never felt like work from that day forward. In fact, I often felt guilty for enjoying my job so much whilst others moaned that they hated their work. My main two mantras have always been to only buy cars that I would love to own myself and always

treat people how you would expect to be treated.

After ten years of trading on the outskirts of Berkeley I moved to Gaunts Earthcott, where I developed a beautiful business premises in the grounds of my 400-year-old cottage. Sadly, no sooner had I completed the development work, the motor trade took its first prolonged downturn. The effects of the earlier recession had finally caught up with us and there were far fewer lease cars being released into the market resulting in very high demand, and prices, within the trade. Unfortunately, as we were still recovering from recession, customers didn't want to pay more for their cars, so our profit margins were hit badly. So, totally unaware of the impending pandemic, and in a bid to greatly reduce my overheads, I sold up my lovely house and returned to the village I more less grew up in. Both the pandemic and the rise of internet-based car sales has meant it is unlikely that I will return to selling cars full-time, but my



passion is still strong, and I will continue to help friends, family, neighbours and my many loyal customers with the buying, selling or cleaning of their cars. Having sold well over 1000 cars over the years, I have learned a thing or two about preparing them ready for sale and I have an armoury of specialist



equipment to help me. To this end, I have decided to put my knowledge, skills and equipment to good use. I think it's fair to say I enjoy cleaning cars almost as much as buying them, and guite frankly the dirtier they are the better. Most people don't notice the paintwork of their car getting duller as it happens over such a long period of time, but the reality is most cars (especially dark colours) require attention every 3 or 4 years. Usually this entails a 'machine polish', after removing all the surface contaminants such as tar, tree sap etc the car is polished all over with a machine. This is usually a three-stage process starting with a heavy cutting polish and finishing with a very light polish. The results can be amazing,

and there is an example of a Ford Focus that I treated on the back page of this issue of Meeting Point.

Once you have your car looking great again you want to keep it that way, in the past we've all used polish, wax or sealants which were often marketed by main dealers as 'lifetime' products. The reality is several months down the line, the wax/polish has worn off and your paint starts to deteriorate again. Thankfully, a couple of years ago ceramic coating was developed – I can honestly say I have never in all my years of cleaning cars found another product like it. The ceramic layer also provides a much deeper shine and helps prevent light scratches and paint damage caused by bird droppings etc. The best bit being, provided no aggressive cleaning products are used, the ceramic coating can last five years, with only a quick yearly top up required.

Most of my interior cleaning is carried out using a professional steam cleaning machine which uses steam vapour to remove and sanitise ingrained dirt and grease. I also have an upholstery/carpet cleaning machine for heavier soiling/spills and a specialist odour removal machine. There are very few obstacles I haven't conquered over the years, including spilt paint, dried on concrete, cigarette and dog smells, mouldy trim and rusty chrome. One thing for certain, I'm always up for a challenge.

To finish, and on a very personal note, I would just like to thank everyone in Olveston for making me feel so welcome. It's an amazing village and I feel blessed to be living here.



Get on your Bike and Support Pilning Station I.C.Awkley,

Transport Correspondent

Over the years, Meeting Point has included many articles from the Pilning Station Group – which campaigns to keep the station open and to encourage local people to make use of it. Back in 2017, in response to one of these articles, I came up with a suggestion for an outing, which included taking the train from Pilning and combining it with a bike ride. Inspired by the article, Meeting Point committee member Derek Baker gave it a go:


"Cycling from Olveston I caught the early train from Pilning and it was just a 20 minute train ride to Temple Meads. Conveniently it was then just 15 minutes before the train departure to Severn Beach. At Severn Beach I followed the advice from the article and had a bacon roll and mug of tea but had this in Shirley's Café next door to the station! From there it is a very pleasant route back just as described. The whole around trip from Olveston and back was about two and a half hours. A very pleasant morning out and one I can thoroughly recommend for doing something different".

Here are my updated instructions for this trip, which I do regularly on a Saturday morning, if you are interested in giving it a try before the summer is over.

- Cycle to Pilning Station, put the bike on the train and catch the 08.33 to Temple Meads, then catch the 09.11 to Severn Beach, arriving just before 09.50 (cost with an old codger's railcard is £4.15).
- Then treat yourself to an excellent bacon sandwich and cup of tea in the café situated by the shops, followed by riding along the sea wall to New Passage, with beautiful views across the Severn, turning right into New Passage Road. The tranquillity of this lane has been ruined by the constant flow of lorries servicing the nearby seawall improvement project, so take care if cycling with little ones.
- Just before the lane starts to climb, by a salmon pink house on the left, turn left onto the 4/41 National Cycle route. The entrance to this is partially hidden by large bushes and is easily missed.
- Then using this cycle path which avoids Pilning and the busy A403. you'll come out into the stub of Northwick Road by the White Horse at Northwick, (all main roads thus avoided). You then have the choice of cycling back to Olveston via Northwick Road, Bilsham Lane and Ingst or Redham Lane and Greenditch Street.
- An alternative to this plan would be to catch the 15.32 from Pilning (NB Saturdays only) which would have you passing the White Horse

in time for a pint or two! The only problem with this plan being that the White Horse has not reopened following its closure due to the Covid19 pandemic. However, next door is the newly opened Central Pook Café at Vine Farm, where non-alcoholic drinks and snacks can be purchased.

Two last points to perhaps note. Trains only stop at Pilning on Saturdays, with weekend train journeys often being adversely affected by essential railway maintenance. It might be worth checking out planned disruption before setting off. See https://www.gwr.com/travel-information/travel-updates/planned-engineering. Second, the increase in 'staycations' has meant that many more people with children and dogs are walking along the seawall at Severn Beach. Cyclists therefore need to go slowly and be ready to react to unpredictable movement, whether it be of the two, or four-legged variety.

The Parish Council does not meet in August but continues to work behind the scenes. We have recently been contacted by residents about issues including litter, dog waste, grass cutting and road safety. Most of these are the responsibility of South Gloucestershire Council (SGC), but the Parish Council will try to help where possible, within our limited powers and budget.

Litter has been a particular problem around Aust. We have decided to fund a new litter and dog waste bin between the two tunnels on the entrance to Aust village via Sandy Lane. The new bin will be in place soon and will hopefully reduce the amount of litter dropped as people enter the village. Another area of concern is the Severn Bridge viewpoint, which attracts many casual visitors. The Parish Council is grateful to several Aust residents who have kindly been collecting litter in this area for some time.

We are aware that a number of roadside verges in the Parish are in dire need of cutting. The issue has been raised with SGC and will hopefully have been addressed by the time you are reading this. Residents can raise any areas of particular concern using the online 'Report It' tool on the SGC website: www.southglos.gov.uk/general-information/online-services/report/. You can also report problems with highways, litter, waste services and many other issues using the tool.

The Parish Council is now back to meeting in person. Meetings are held in Elberton village hall on the second Tuesday of the month at 7.30pm. The next meeting is on 13th September. St Mary's Church Tower Restoration Project



Well, the 'fairy story' came true at last and work has begun on the tower after many years of planning and fund raising - for which thank you all.

The Graveyard Team did a great job in clearing the sheds (you would not believe the amount of stuff the church collects) and they are continuing to maintain the churchyard from a much smaller space. The contractor's yard is adjacent to the east end of the church, next to the churchyard wall and quite close to the bottom of the scaffolding. All is enclosed by high metal fencing and protected by an alarm system. It's

all quite tight around the end of the church, but care has been taken to retain a path to the main churchyard and to its tap.

The scaffolding went up at remarkable speed but will have taken a month to complete. The old pinnacles will be lowered to the ground, and one will be set up temporarily in church alongside the new one for comparison. Summer Butterflies

In the July issue of Meeting Point I featured butterflies which could be seen during spring into early summer. In this article I have focussed on four butterflies you may have seen whilst out on walks locally, or within your gardens, during summer. They are by no means the only butterflies present and you may observe plenty of others such as Meadow Browns, Ringlets, Peacocks, Painted Ladies, Whites (Small, Large and Green Veined) and Brimstone.

Habitat is a key consideration to the success of butterflies throughout their life cycle (eggs, caterpillars, chrysalis and adult). In our garden this year we have not only kept a variety of pollen or nectar rich plants in flower throughout the year, but also kept long grass areas and sown clover and daisies inspired by 'No Mow May'. In addition, grass verges and hedgerows along our roads being kept long, and some fields kept as meadows allowing grasses and wildflowers to grow, has had notable results for insects.

The butterflies I have included here are some of the most colourful we may see locally within our gardens and local countryside at this time of year. All photographs have been taken locally between late June and early August.

Marbled White



Marbled Whites can be found in areas of unimproved grassland. They have been very abundant this year and I have observed them in large numbers on Stroud Common near Old Down and also in grass

fields off of Bond Lane leading down to Kington. This photograph was taken in July on Stroud Common. It is a very distinctive butterfly and unlikely to be mistaken for any other.

The adult Marbled White is quite often observed low within tall grasses laying eggs, as well as flying over different feeding areas such as thistles and knapweed. Interestingly it is within the Nymphalide family and not the Pieridae (whites and yellows) as it is classified as a 'Brown'. Its main season as an adult is mid-June until the end of August and is most frequently seen in sunny weather. Eggs are laid in July and August in either Red Fescue or Tor Grass, and hatch after three weeks. The caterpillar once emerged immediately hibernates until spring, the chrysalis is then formed close to the ground within the grasses, and it emerges as an adult in approximately three weeks.

Marbled White distribution is typically the southern half of England and some parts of South Wales. It is absent from Scotland and largely absent from large parts of eastern and northern England, although in some years it has begun to extend its habitat northwards.

Comma



The Comma is also within the Nymphalid family and is unique due to its ragged outline. They can be observed from March into September and produce two broods.

Comma eggs are laid on nettle leaves and hatch after about three weeks. It spends approximately seven weeks at the caterpillar stage, a further two as a chrysalis, until the adult emerges.

All adults from the second brood hibernate and can therefore be one of the first butterflies to be seen. I believe there have been greater numbers this summer. We had some early visitors into our garden in Olveston at the beginning of February, but have seen them much more frequently throughout July feeding on the lavender. They have been observed in woodland glades such as those around Oldbury Power Station and lanes, where its main food

types of common nettles, catkins, fallen fruit and flowers such as buddleia, are present.



It is called a Comma due to the white marking on the underside of its wing and when its wings are closed it resembles a dead leaf and is therefore well camouflaged. It has a gliding flight pattern, ragged wings and beautiful colouration and it is the blend of these things which catches my eye when it is amongst other similar butterflies. The comma had been in serious decline, but

populations have significantly recovered in its main territories in the south and it is now beginning to expand northwards.

Gatekeeper



In local hedgerows and woodland edges the Gatekeeper (also known as the Hedge Brown) has been a very common sight this year, especially when the sun has shone. Again, another beautiful butterfly which can been seen resting on bramble or other such leaves. It is also frequently seen on the flower of

ragwort. Its caterpillars are dependent on meadow grasses, common couch, common bent and red fescues. It has very distinctive colouration a rich orange colour with chocolate-coloured patterns. It is found in the southern half of the UK and is not present in Scotland or Northern Ireland. This photograph was taken near Elberton church.

The Gatekeeper is found in small colonies and will stay very much local to that colony. The adult has a short flight season between July and August. It then lays its eggs within grasses, which then emerge after three weeks to form the caterpillar. This stage lasts for nine months where it hibernates. The chrysalis is formed in June and the adult emerges in approximately three weeks This

butterfly, whilst not at risk, is very vulnerable. It is dependent on hedgerows and, at the caterpillar stage, on meadow grasses. A single colony of Gatekeepers can easily be disrupted or destroyed if those habitats are destroyed

Small Tortoiseshell



Another very attractive butterfly which is resident across the UK. It can be found in many locations and habitats including mountain tops. Depending on the availability of food, adults may have up to three broods per year. It is a very successful butterfly, but annual populations can fluctuate from year to

year due to parasitic wasps. This year however would appear to be a highly successful year with plenty feeding on nectar rich plants in fields and gardens. I saw flowers on sale outside the Olveston Stores, where at one point there must have been ten Small Tortoiseshells feeding. This photograph was taken on lavender plants in our garden.

The Small Tortoiseshell can be one of the first butterflies to be seen in a year because the adult hibernates over winter and re-emerges on warm days to feed in March. Eggs are laid within nettles between April and beginning of August when they emerge on the nettle as caterpillars for about four weeks. The caterpillars initially form an untidy web until they are fully grown. The chrysalis stage last for twelve days until the adult emerges. In summer males can be seen frequently spiralling in the sky duelling with other males for territories. Flowers such as lavender and buddleia are important to the feeding adult, and common and small nettles for the eggs and caterpillars. They begin to consider hibernation during August, when you may find them in sheds and other outbuildings where they should not be disturbed if possible.

If you are interested in butterfly conservation and identification, the Butterfly Conservation Group: www.butterfly-conservation.org is a good source of information.



Manor was required by government to hold an annual 'Court Leet', a meeting at which village officials were appointed to their roles and a jury of local people was summoned to adjudicate on matters (essentially 'village housekeeping' concerns).



The proceedings of the Court Leet were recorded in a Manorial Record book – and it's these volumes, containing over one hundred years of recorded minutes for the Manors of Olyeston and Elberton, that have been purchased by Eric Garrett, our OPHS archivist. In March 2020, a group of OPHS members undertook a project to read and transcribe the Court Leet records and, in the process, learn something about village life.

In 1771, the village Constable was Peter Boulton, and he was able to report to the Court held on 24th October that "All is well". The Jury of 13, led by Mr Richard Ward, Foreman, dealt with 23 complaints, called 'Presentments', For instance.

"They Present Mr William Hollister to lop the Trees cut the Hedge & shear the Ditch six foot wide & bottom it one Foot deeper from the corner of Baghurst to the corner of Bilsom Lane by Christmas next on pain of six pence per Perch ".

The Jury set the deadline for the work to be carried out and set a fine to be imposed if the work was not completed in time. It is clear from the Leets that the clearance and maintenance of ditches to provide drainage was a high priority.

Even the Lord of the Manor did not escape censure:

"They request Robert Cann Jefferies Esquire or Tenant William Wilton to lay the Hedge & Shroud the Trees at the Bottom of Brooks Tything against the Sandy Lane by Christmas next on pain of three pence per Perch".

But note that the Lord of the Manor is respectfully 'requested' rather than 'presented'!

The Court Leet also met in Elberton on the day following (25th October 1771) and dealt with similar concerns:

"They Present Mrs Hester Roberts to cut the Hedges and shroud the Trees from her Innlands up to Elberton Downs Gate in Sandy Lane by Christmas next on pain of four pence per Perch, the same not being done according to a former Presentment".

The Court Leet records are a rich source of information about village life. The names of all the Freeholders, Leaseholders and Resiants (other parishioners) who were present at the Court Leet and those who defaulted (and were fined for non-appearance) are listed in the minutes. From all the Presentments we can learn who is a tenant of whom, and the names of many local fields and who held them. Those appointed to be Officers or members of the Jury give us an idea of who were the socially responsible members of the community and the Presentments name those who were serial defaulters!

We hope to be able to describe some of the highlights of the project at a future meeting of OPHS. (Watch this space!)



The Earth is the Lord's and all that is in it... He makes grass grow for the cattle, and plants for man to cultivate - bringing forth food from the earth: wine that gladdens the heart of man, oil to make his face shine, and bread that sustains his heart.' Psalm 104, 14-15

With September comes the season of Harvest Festivals, one of the oldest known Christian festivals, which is not really surprising as humanity is dependent on the gifts that God gives us for sustenance. To give thanks is a natural human gesture, especially when your lives are dependent upon the success of the crop. Originally, it is likely that when the Israelites entered the Promised Land after their period in the wilderness, they adapted the agricultural festivals of their neighbours.

Our Harvest Festival corresponds to the Feast of Tabernacles, which is described as "the feast of ingathering, at the end of the year" (Exodus 23:16). This was the last and greatest feast of the Jewish year, and it was sometimes simply referred to as 'the feast'. Traditionally, the date of the Harvest Festival, like Lent, was related to the lunar cycle and was held on or near the Sunday of the Harvest Moon which takes place at the time of the Autumn Equinox in mid-September.

Harvest Festivals in churches as we know them today began in 1843 when Reverend Robert Hawker invited parishioners to a special thanksgiving service for the harvest at his church at Morwenstow in Cornwell. Victorian hymns such as 'We plough the fields and scatter', 'Come ye thankful people come' and 'All things bright and beautiful' were used in the service. While as individuals we are not as dependent upon the success of the harvest, a bad harvest is still devastating for farmers in the western world and for individuals and villages in developing countries, where they are still reliant upon its success.

In recent years, many people in the UK have become dependent on food banks to help supply their needs; there are now over 2,000 in the UK. The impact of the pandemic has meant that now even more people are forced to rely on them, and I don't think this situation is going to reduce in the short term as the country recovers. As a Benefice all our churches support local food banks so maybe, as Harvest time approaches, we could use this well-known celebration to raise awareness, or simply remind people, of the needs of those who are less fortunate than ourselves.
